

State of Virginia, Rockingham County, to-wit:

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE SAID COUNTY:

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham, and now attending the said Court, upon their oath present, that on the 25th day of April, in the year 1887, a special election upon the question of "liquor license" or "no liquor license," was held in and for Central Magisterial District, in said county, in accordance with Chapter 248, Acts of Assembly of Virginia, 1885-'86,—at which said election a majority of the votes cast were cast against license for the sale of intoxicating liquors within the limits of the said Magisterial District, thereby prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors within the limits of said Magisterial District after the 30th day of April, 1887, the day upon which license to sell wine, ardent spirits, &c., in said Magisterial District under the then existing law would expire. And that A. J. Vampell, on the 13th day of April, in the year 1889, and on divers other days since the said day of ~~in the year 1889~~ within the six months immediately preceding the 21st day of June in the year 1889 within the limits of said Magisterial District, in said county, did then and there unlawfully sell intoxicating liquors to W. H. Wine, Spirituous and malt liquors and a mixture thereof against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of Charles Long, Chas. Rogers, J. D. Davis & C. Mosby witnesses sworn in court and sent before the Grand Jury to give evidence.

Be it remembered that on the 28th day of June 1889.

A. J. Vainfelt and Anna M. E. Vainfelt of the said County came personally before me A. C. Rohr a Justice of the said County and each acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the manner and form following to wit.

The said A. J. Vainfelt in the sum of \$150⁰⁰, good and lawful money of the United States, and the said Annie M. E. Vainfelt in the sum of \$150⁰⁰, like good and lawful money to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels lands and tenements to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia, if the said A. J. Vainfelt shall make default in the performance of the underwritten obligation.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound A. J. Vainfelt do and shall personally appear ~~before~~ on the 1st day of July 1889, at the hour of 10 o'clock A.M. at the Sheriffs office in the said County there to answer before A. C. Rohr Justice as aforesaid or some other Justice or Justices of the said County the charge of having sold on the day of 188- and on divers other days within the twelve months last preceeding this date, spirituous liquors and a mixture thereof to wit whiskey, then the ^{above} obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue taken and acknowledged before me the day and year first above written.
