In the County Court of the said County -

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham, and now attending the said Court, Upon their oath present that William A. Johnson on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year 1890, in the said County, feloniously did forge a certain writing - purporting to be an order drawn by one Wilson Barber on R. E. Sullivan and payable to the bearer for the payment of One dollar and fifty cents, and purporting to be dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January 1890, - with intent to defraud against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia -

And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present, that William A. Johnson on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year 1890 in the said County, feloniously did utter and attempt to employ as true a certain <sup>forged</sup> writing - purporting to be an order, drawn by one Wilson Barber on R. E. Sullivan and payable to the bearer, for the payment of One dollar and fifty cents and purporting to be dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January 1890 - with intent to defraud; he the said William A. Johnson at the time he so uttered and attempted to employ as true the said last mentioned forged writing, to wit, on the said 27<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year 1890 in the County aforesaid, well knowing the same to be forged, against



the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of
