

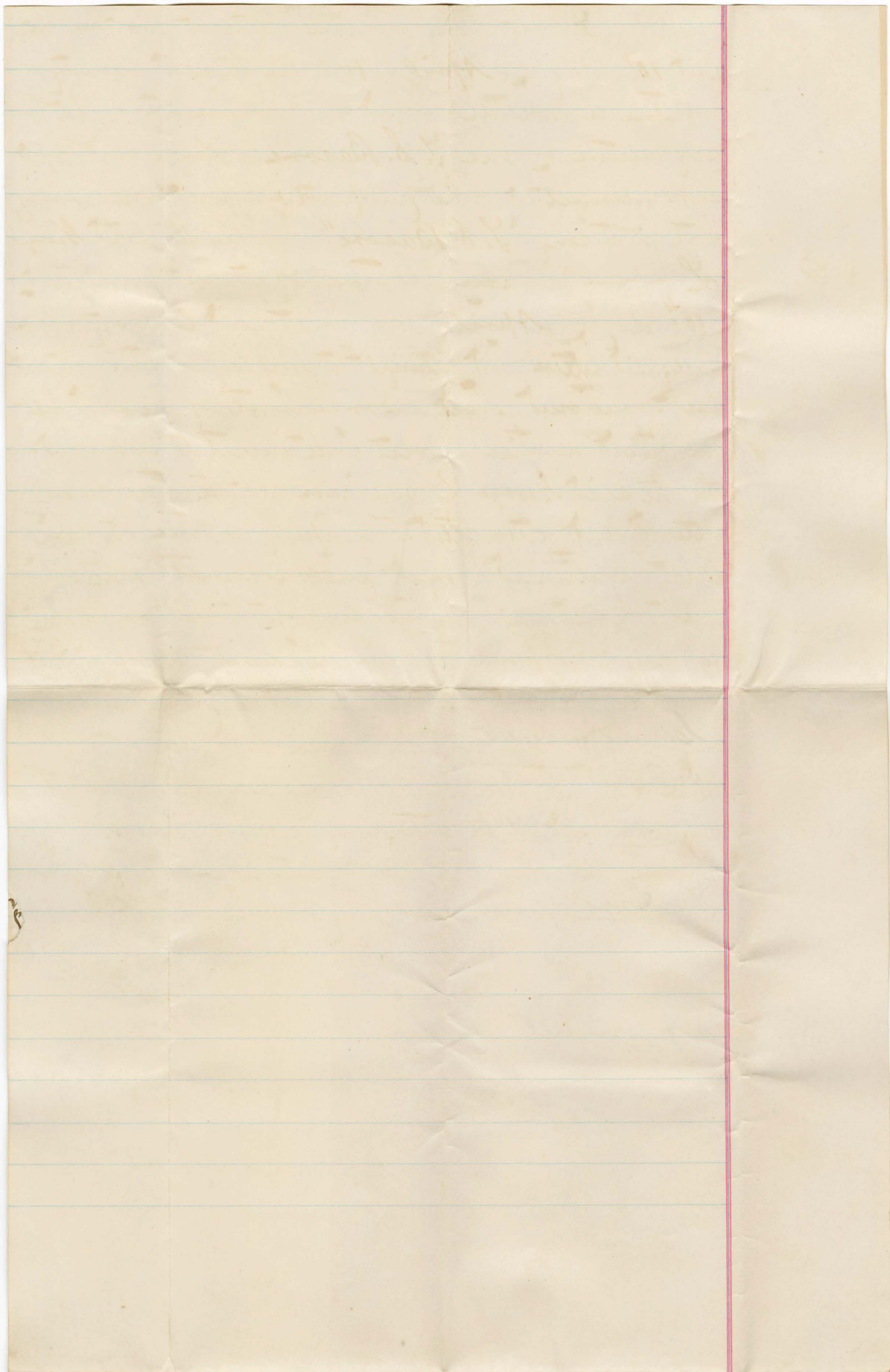
State of Virginia, Rockingham County - To wit -

In the County Court of the said County -

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham and now attending the said Court - Upon their oath present that George L. Jamison on the 10th day of April in the year 1890 in the said County, having in his possession a certain negotiable note, purporting to be signed by ^{J. S. Basore} George Jamison and to be negotiable payable at the First National Bank of Harrisburg Va to Henry Blosser ^{Miller for Abraham Blosser} Com^r on the 10th day of May 1890 for the sum of One hundred dollars and of date the 10th day of April 1890, did then & there feloniously forge on the back of the aforesaid negotiable note an endorsement in writing purporting to be the signature of the said J. S. Basore to whom the said note was payable, which said forged endorsement is of the purport following, that is to say "J. S. Basore" with intent to defraud against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present that the said George L. Jamison afterwards, to wit, on the said 10th day of April 1890 in the said County, having in his custody and possession a certain other negotiable note purporting to be signed by George L. Jamison, ^{and J. S. Basore} and to be negotiable and payable at the First National Bank of Harrisburg Virginia to Henry Blosser ^{Miller for Abraham Blosser} Com^r on the 10th day of May 1890 for the sum of One hundred dollars, and of date April 10th - 1890, and on the back of which last

mentioned note there was then there, to wit, on the
said 10th day of April 1890 in the said County,
wrote a certain forged endorsement of the
signature of one J. S. Basore which said forged
endorsement is of the purport & effect following,
that is to say "J. S. Basore", in the said George
L. Jamison afterwards to wit on the said
10th day of April 1890 in the said County felon-
ously did utter and attempt to employ as true the said
last mentioned forged endorsement of the said last-
mentioned negotiable note, with intent to defraud.
In the said George L. Jamison at the time he so
uttered and attempted to employ as true the said
last mentioned forged endorsement of the said
last mentioned negotiable note to wit on the said
10th day of April 1890 in the County aforesaid, well
knowing the said last mentioned endorsement to
be forged against the peace and dignity of
the Commonwealth of Virginia - This indict-
ment is found on the testimony of John Travel, J. S.
Basore and Henry Blosser witnesses sworn in Court
and sent before the Grand Jury to give evidence -
