Be it remembered that on the 30th day of Sept 1891, H. P. Sites, and Charles Y. Beard of the said County came before me J. H. Keiter, a Justice of said County and severally and respectively acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in manner and form following, that is to say: The said H. P. Sites in the sum of Five Hundred dollars, and the said Charles Y. Beard in the sum of Five Hundred dollars to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia if the said Charles Y. Beard shall make default of the condition underwritten. The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Charles Y. Beard, do and shall personally appear before the County Court of Rockingham County on the first day of the next term thereof and then and there to answer the Commonwealth for and concerning a certain Felony by him committed in feloniously breaking and entering the dwelling house, the property of George Cave, and pulling down and hauling away from the land of George Cave and appropriating to

his own use the said house to the amount of thirty dollars wherewith the said Charles Y. Beard stands charged and shall not depart thence without the leave of said Court then the above recognizance shall be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.

And the said H. P. Sites and Charles Y. Beard have waived the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this obligation.

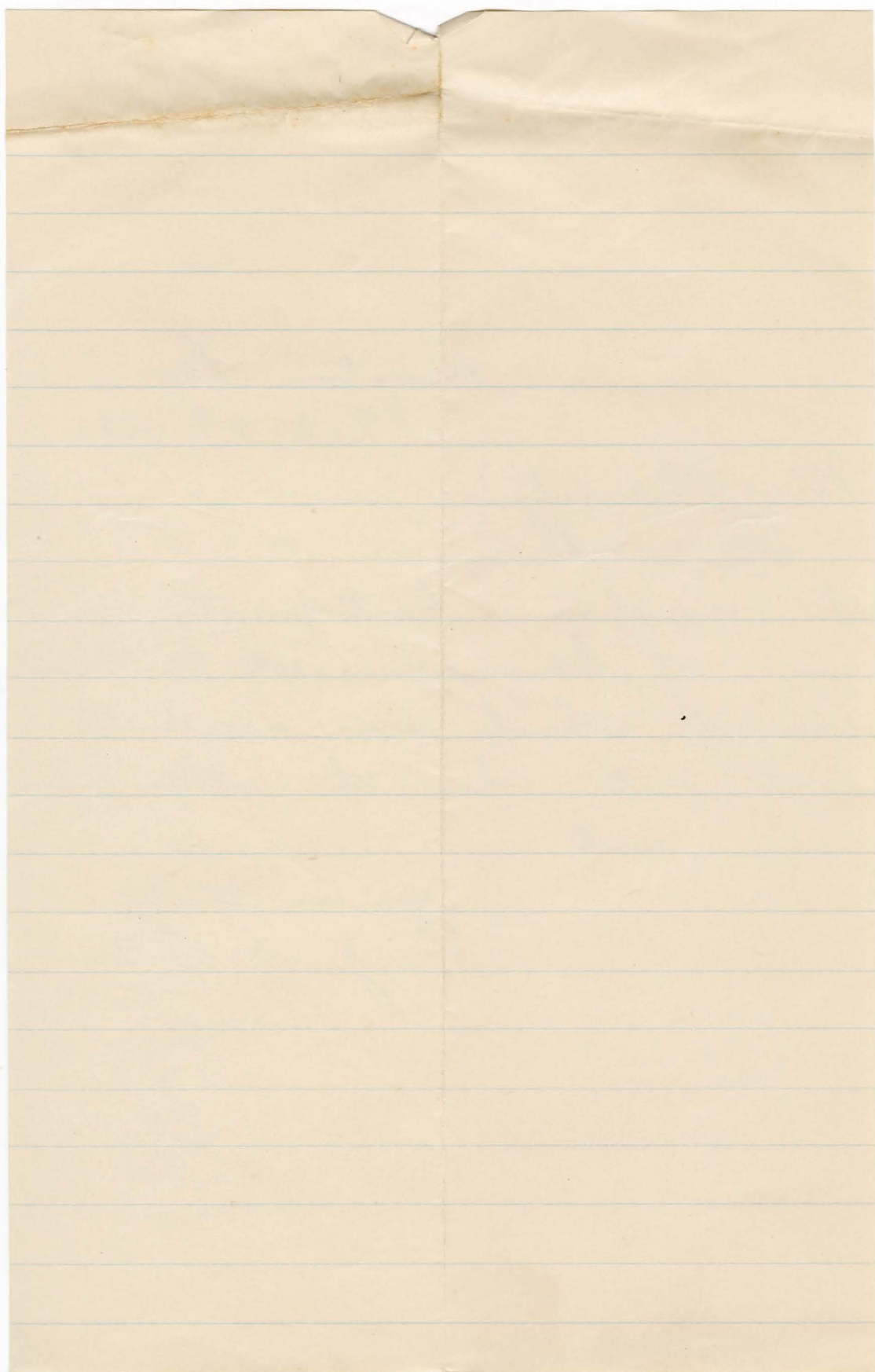
