Harvey feloniously and violently did steal, take  
and carry away against the peace and dignity  
of the Commonwealth of Virginia - This indictment  
is found on the testimony of Henrietta Harvey

plaint and information on oath before me A. G. Rohr

house of the said Henrietta Harvey with intent  
to commit robbery, and there and there in the
