

State of Virginia - Rockingham County - To wit -

In the County Court of the said County -

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the County of Rockingham and now attending the said Court - Upon their oath present, that William Cave on the 6th day of August in the year 1892 in the said County, in and upon the body of one James H. Dofflemeyer feloniously, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly and of his malice aforethought an assault did make; and that he the said William Cave a certain pistol then and there loaded with gunpowder and leaden ball, which said pistol he the said William Cave in his right hand then and there had and held, then and there feloniously, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly and of his malice aforethought did discharge and shoot off to, against; and upon him the said James H. Dofflemeyer; and that he the said William Cave, with the said leaden ball out of the said pistol, by the said William Cave discharged and shot off as aforesaid, then and there feloniously, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly and of his malice aforethought did strike, penetrate, and wound him the said James H. Dofflemeyer in and upon the left breast of him the said James H. Dofflemeyer near the nipple, thereby giving to him the said James H. Dofflemeyer then and there with the leaden ball aforesaid, so as aforesaid discharged and shot out of the pistol aforesaid, by the said William Cave, in and upon the left breast of him the said James H. Dofflemeyer near the nipple, one mortal wound, of which said mortal wound he the said James H. Dofflemeyer on the said 6th day of August in the said year 1892 in the County aforesaid instantly died; and that David Cabbage and Andrew Stanley then

and there, on the day and year aforesaid, in the County aforesaid,
at the very time and place, feloniously, wilfully, deliberately,
premeditatedly and of their malice aforesaid, were pre-
sent counselling, inciting, prompting, procuring, aiding,
abetting, and assisting the said William Cave the wound-
ing, killing, murder and felony aforesaid to do and commit;
And so the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do
say that the said William Cave, David Cabbage and Andrew
Stanley on the said 6th day of August in the year 1892, in the
County aforesaid, in manner and form aforesaid, and
by the means aforesaid, him the said James H. Dofflemeyer
feloniously, wilfully, deliberately premeditatedly and of their
malice aforesaid did kill and murder against the
peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia -

And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do
further present, that William Cave on the 6th day of August
in the year 1892, in the said County, in and upon the body
of one James H. Dofflemeyer feloniously, wilfully, deliberately,
premeditatedly, and of his malice aforesaid an assault did
make; and that he the said William Cave a certain pis-
tol then and there loaded with gunpowder and leaden ball,
which said pistol he the said William Cave in his right hand
then and there had and held, then and there feloniously, wilful-
ly, premeditatedly, deliberately, and of his malice aforesaid
did discharge and shot off to, against and upon him the
said James H. Dofflemeyer; and that he the said William
Cave, with the said leaden ball out of the said pistol by the said
William Cave discharged and shot off as aforesaid, then and
there feloniously, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly and of

his malice aforethought - did strike, penetrate and wound
him the said James H. Dofflumper in and upon the left-breast,
of him the said James H. Dofflumper, near the nipple, thereby
giving to him the said James H. Dofflumper thin and thine with
the leaden ball aforesaid, so as aforesaid discharged and shot
out of the pistol aforesaid, by the said William Cave, in and
upon the left-breast, of him the said James H. Dofflumper, near
the nipple, one mortal wound, of which said mortal wound
he the said James H. Dofflumper on the said 6th day of August
in the year 1892 in the County aforesaid instantly died - And
so the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do say
that he the said William Cave, on the said 6th day of August in the
year 1892, in the County aforesaid, in manner and form aforesaid,
and by the means aforesaid him the said James H. Dofflumper feloniously
wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly and of his malice aforethought did
kill and murder - And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath
aforesaid do further present that David Cabbage and An-
drew Stanley before the said felony and murder was com-
mitted, in manner and form aforesaid, to wit - on the said 6th
day of August in the year aforesaid, in the County aforesaid did fe-
loniously, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly and of their malice
aforethought counsel, advise, procure, aid and abet the said
William Cave to do and commit the said felony and murder in
manner and form aforesaid against the peace and dignity of
of the Commonwealth of Virginia - This Indictment is found on
the testimony of John W. Snyder, A. J. Sigler, James Baedem, E. D.
Gibson, J. H. Rose, P. H. Dovel, D^r. W^r. H. Coffman, L. B. Robey and
James H. Price witnesses sworn in Court and sent before
the Grand Jury to give evidence -

We the Jury find the prisoners guilty of murder in second degree. And fix their terms of imprisonment as follows, in Penitentiary.

William Cave. 12. Years
David Cabbage 12. years
Andrew Stanley 5. years

We the Jury find the prisoners William Cave ^{not guilty of Murder in the first degree but} David Cabbage and Andrew Stanley guilty of Murder in the second degree in manner and form as charged in the Indictment and ascertain the term of the Confinement of the said William Cave and David Cabbage in the penitentiary at twelve years each and ascertain the term of the Confinement of the said Andrew Stanley in the penitentiary Commonwealth at Five years.
