

To any one or all of the Constables of the said County -
Whereas John Lang - Chief of Police of the Town of
Harrisonburg - has this day made complaint and
information on oath before me A. C. Proby a
Justice of the Peace in and for the said County
that Guy Webster on the ~~on the~~ 17th day of De-
cember in the year 1892 in the said County
did unlawfully, maliciously and feloniously attempt
to strike, bruise and wound one William Whit-
lock with intent to the said William Whitlock
to maim, disfigure, disable and kill, and that
in the said attempt to commit the crime and
felony aforesaid the said Guy Webster did
then & there unlawfully and feloniously strike
bruise and wound one Oliver H. Ott -
There are therefore to Command you in
the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia to
forthwith apprehend the said Guy Webster and bring
him before me or some other Justice of the said
County to answer the said Complaint and to
be further dealt with according to law -

State of Virginia Rockingham County to wit.
Be it remembered that on this 24th day of December
1892. Robert Cummings- Adam Wine and Newton
Webster of the said County personally came before
me A. G. Rohr a Justice of said County and
severally and respectively acknowledged themselves to
be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in
the manner and form following that is to say
The said Robert Cummings- Adam Wine and
Newton Webster jointly in the sum of \$500⁰⁰
good and lawful money of the United States-
to be respectively made and levied of their sev-
eral goods and chattels lands and tenements to
the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia if
Guy Webster shall make default in the per-
formance of the underwritten conditions. Each
waiving their Homestead Exemption as to their obligation.

The condition of the above recognizance is such
that if the said Guy Webster do and shall per-
sonally appear on the 19th day of February 1893
before the County Court of said County at the
Court House thereof it being the first day
of the February term thereof and then and
there to answer a bill of indictment to be
preferred to the grand Jury in and for the
said County against him the said Guy
Webster for a felony by him committed for
unlawfully and feloniously attempting to strike
blow and wound one William Whitham

with intent him the said William Whitlock to maim
disable disfigure and kill and that in the said
attempt to commit the crime and felony aforesaid
he the said Guy Webster did then and there unlaw-
fully and feloniously strike bruise and wound
one Oliver W. R. whereof the said Guy
Webster stands charged, and shall not thence
depart without the leave of said Court. Then the
above recognizance shall be void otherwise to
remain in full force and virtue.
