McShane and all the parties live in Herkansack County, and Smith was arrested in that County, upon a new warrant, with a rather a duplicate of the one I enclose, with name <sup>of</sup> ~~Hudson~~ County, <sup>of</sup> Bergen, which I filed when Comptroller Neff took Smith before me, the offence was committed just this side of the line dividing the two counties, in the hurry, and the lateness of the day, the endorsement may not be the same exactly, in the two warrants, in words, but in substance and meaning are the same.


