The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia in and for the body of the County of Rockingham and now attending the said Court - Upon their oath present - that John J. Wood on the 5th day of November in the year 1893, in the said County, in and upon the body of one Enoch Roach, did unlawfully, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly, feloniously, and of his malice aforethought - make an assault; and that he, the said John J. Wood, a certain gun then and there loaded with gunpowder and leaden shot - and in both of his hands then and there had and held, then and there did unlawfully, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly, feloniously, and of his malice aforethought - discharge and shoot-off to, against - and upon him the said Enoch Roach; and that he the said John J. Wood, with the said leaden shot, out of the said gun discharged and shot-off as aforesaid, then and there did unlawfully, wilfully, deliberately, premeditatedly, feloniously, and of his malice aforethought, strike, penetrate, and wound him the said Enoch Roach, in and upon the left-portion of his body, below the left-breast; thereby giving to him the said Enoch Roach, then and there with the leaden shot aforesaid, so as aforesaid discharged and shot-out of the gun aforesaid, by the said John J. Wood, in and upon the left-portion of the body of him the said Enoch Roach below the left-breast; one mortal ^{wound} of which said mortal wound he the said Enoch Roach then and there instantly died - And so the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do say, that he the said John J.
