The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia in and for the body of the County of Rockingham and now attending the said Court - Upon their oath present that Jackson Banks on the day of January in the year 1895 in the said County in the town of Harrisonburg did unlawfully sell wine, ardent spirits, malt liquors and a mixture thereof to one C. W. Vandegrift by retail, and to be drunk at the place where sold without first having obtained a license therefor according to law against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present that Jackson Banks on the day of February in the year 1895 within the last 12 months, in the said County, in the town of Harrisonburg did unlawfully sell wine, ardent spirits, malt liquors and a mixture thereof to one R. E. Braitheville by retail, and to be drunk at the place where sold without first having obtained a license therefor according to law against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present that Jackson Banks on the day of _____ in the year 1894, within the last twelve months, and on divers other days, and at divers other times within the last twelve months

in the said County, in the town of Harrisburgh did
unlawfully sell wine, ardent spirits, malt liquors and
a mixture thereof by retail, and to be drunk at the
place where sold without first having obtained
a license therefor according to law against
the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of
