
These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said



Crawford for a misdemeanor by him committed ^{and for the same time} for unlawfully ^{to keep the peace and act of good behavior} injuring and destroying certain forest trees standing and growing upon a certain piece of land belonging to John E. Roller, and which said trees were the property of the said

John C. Roller, whereof the said James B. Crawford
stands charged, and shall not thence depart without
the leave of said court, then the above recognizance
shall be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in
full force and virtue.
