And One pair of pants of the value of Two dollars

of the goods and chattles of the said Jacob Fisher in the said ~~outhouse~~<sup>dwelling house</sup>, then and there being found, then and there ~~did~~<sup>burglariously</sup> feloniously steal, take and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia. And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do further present, that Suttin Smith on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of February, in the year 1895, in the said County, a certain outhouse, called a dwelling house, the property of one Jacob Fisher not adjoining to or occupied with the dwelling-house of the said there situated, in the ~~day~~<sup>night</sup> time of that day feloniously did break and enter, with intent the goods and chattels of the said Jacob Fisher in the said ~~outhouse~~<sup>dwelling house</sup> then and there being, feloniously to steal, take and carry away. And One pair of pants of the value of Two dollars

of the goods and chattels of the said Jacob Fisher in the said ~~outhouse~~<sup>dwelling house</sup>, then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia. And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do further present, that Suttin Smith, on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of February, in the year 1895, in the said County, a certain outhouse, called a dwelling house, the property of one Jacob Fisher, not adjoining to or occupied with the dwelling-house of the said, there situated, in the night time of that day feloniously did enter, without breaking the same, with intent the goods and chattels of the said Jacob Fisher in the said ~~outhouse~~<sup>dwelling house</sup> then and there being, feloniously to steal, take and carry away. And One pair of pants of the value of Two dollars

of the goods and chattels of the said Jacob Fisher in the said ~~outhouse~~<sup>dwelling house</sup>, then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of Jacob Fisher, Martha Fisher and Algenon Fisher witness sworn in Court and sent before the Grand Jury to give evidence.
