These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said

C. W. Viands
to answer the said complaint, and to be farther dealt with according to law. And you are required to summon Mary Campbell, Bettie Stauchberger, Mary Ann Beck, Gordon Beasley,

to appear and give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth, on the examination touching the said offence.

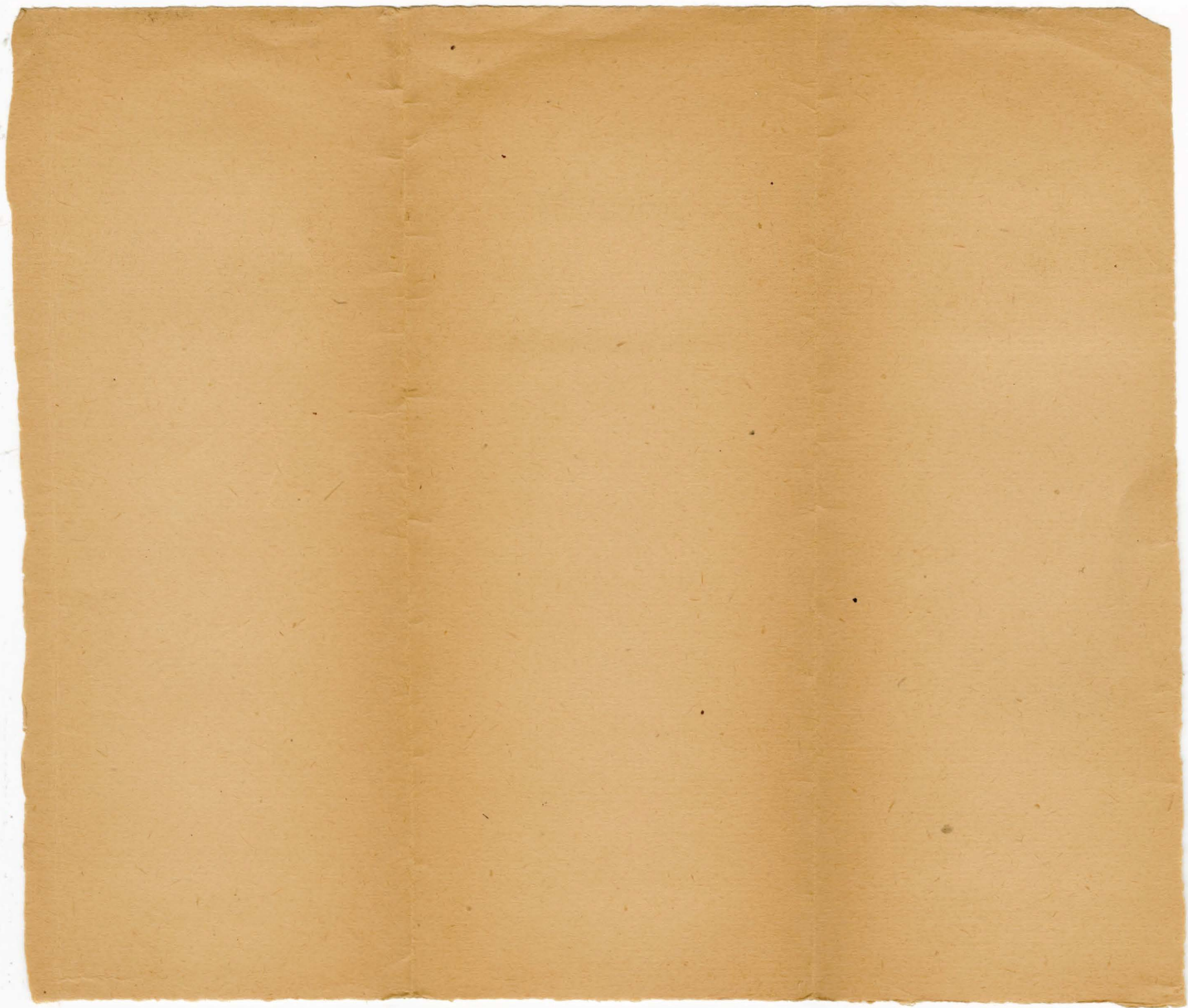

Charge before me R. H. Bridges
Justice of the Said County
on the oath of Gordon Beverly
with the felony by him committed
on this said C. W. Bonds on this 16th
day of Jan - 1849, unlawfully, feloniously
by word of his malice did kill
and murder one Perry Cambell.

And you the said keeper of
the said Jail are hereby
required to receive the said
C. W. Bonds into your Jail
and custody that he may be tried
for the said offense by the
County Court of the said County,
and him there safely keep
until he shall be discharged
by the course of Law given under
my hand this day 17th day of Jan. 1849

upon the view of body of
Desny Cambell there lying
dead. The Jurors sworn to
inquire when, how, and by
what means, the said Desny
Cambell came to his death.
Upon their Oaths, do say
on the 16th of Jan 1849, came to his
death by a pistol shot inflic-
ed by C. W. Viands,
seven under our hands this
17th day of Jan 1849.
