



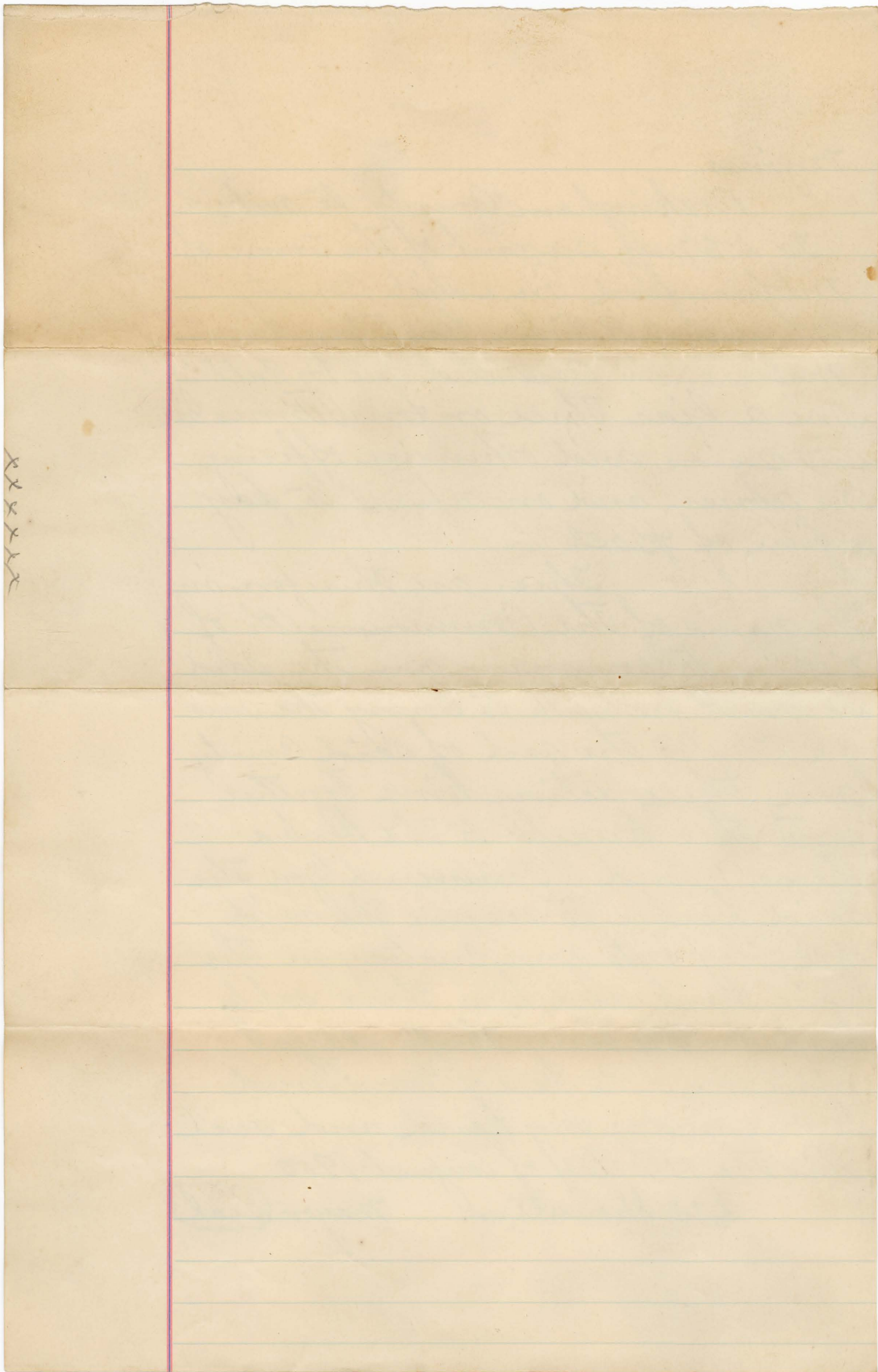
Rockingham County to wit:

and there deliver him together
with this precept to the keeper
thereof: and I Command you the
said keeper to receive the said
J. R. Foley into your custody in the
said jail and him there safely
keep for the term thirty days
from the date hereof mentioned

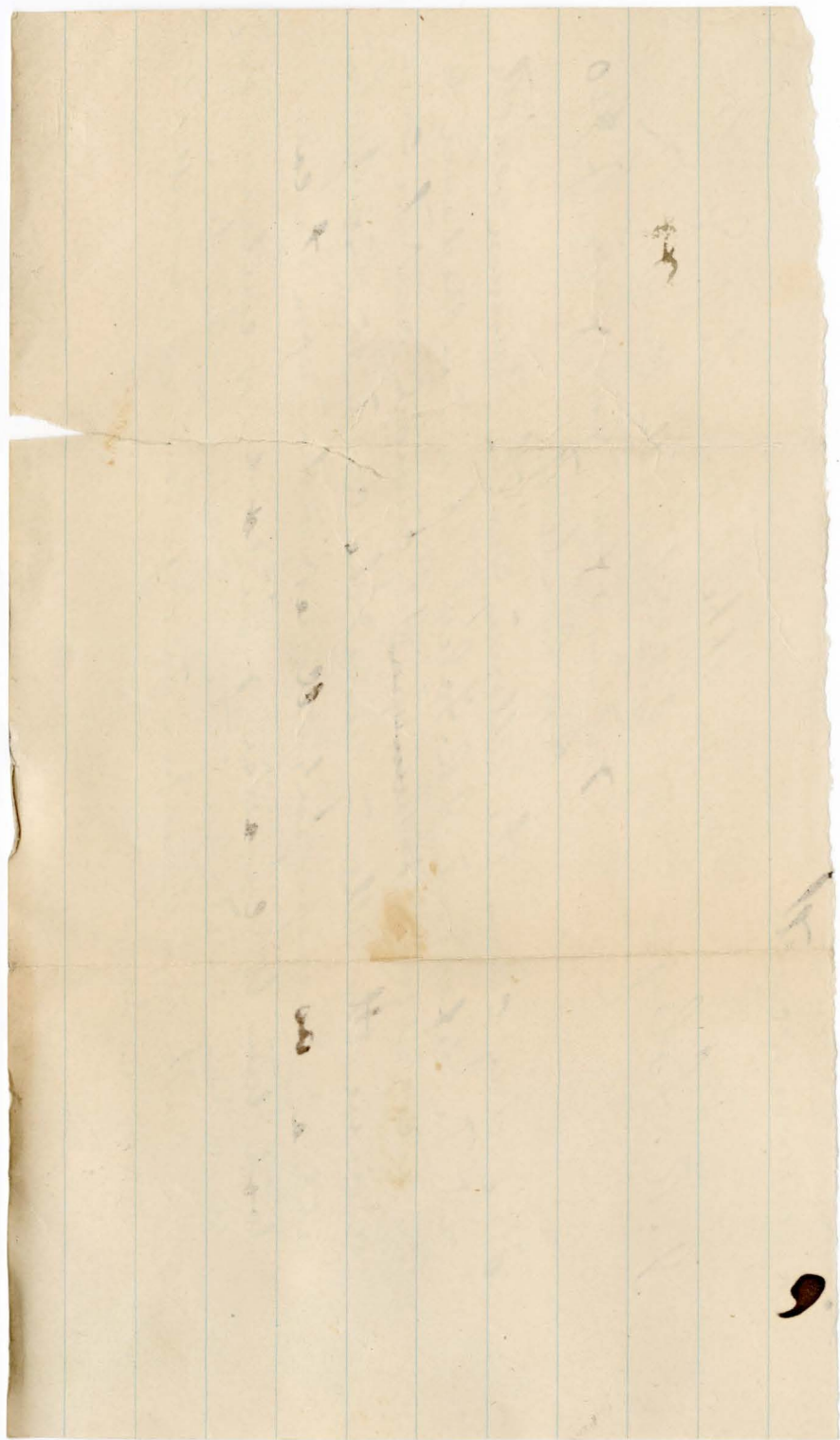
