
Matthew Platts, James Simpson & John Flick

This 21st day of March 1801, before me
Wm. P. Pratt, Justice of Rockingham County,
was delivered the body of John Flick, at
10 o'clock A.M. under the warrant hereunto
attached, and upon examination the
defendant John Flick, is found guilty upon
reasonable suspicion, of Grand Larceny, and
is hereby required to enter into recognizance,
with sufficient surety in the sum of Five
Hundred Dollars, in his appearance before
the County Court of Rockingham County, Va.,
on the first day of the May Term 1801 of
said court, to answer further and charges.
And thereupon said recognizance was given
and hereunto returned to Court and the
said John Flick is discharged from custody.
And at 5 P.M. the witness named Matthew
Platts, was produced before me in custody of
the Sheriff, and no testimony being offered
against him, he is discharged from custody.

This day, O. B. Know all men by these presents, that
we John Flick and W.B. Minard and W.F. Flick
both of the County of Rockingham, are
held and justly bound unto the Common-
wealth of Virginia, in the sum of Five
hundred Dollars, to be paid unto
the Commonwealth. And as to this debt
and obligation, we each hereby waive the
benefit of our Homestead Exemptions
under the laws of the State of Virginia -
Witness our hands and seals, this 21st
day of March 1801.

The condition of the above obligation is
such that whereas the above named John
Flick has this day been examined before
~~Wm. J. Poole, a Justice of the County Court,~~
upon a warrant charging him with
having feloniously taken stolen and
carried away certain goods and wares
the property of D.B. Roller Rec't for the
Broadway Pottery at Broadway, Virginia;
and upon said examination, it being shown
that there is reasonable ground to suspect
the guilt of the said John Flick. Now,
therefore if the said John Flick shall
make good his appearance before the
County Court of the County of Rockingham
Va, on the first day of the May Term
1801 of said Court, to answer further
