and be otherwise dealt with according  
to law.

Rockingham County: to wit:

Be it remembered, that on this the 5th day of January 1901 Jno Snyder and Geo. A. Michael of said county, personally came before me Charles E. Lloyd, a justice for said county and severally acknowledged themselves to owe the Commonwealth of Virginia, the said Jno Snyder the sum of one hundred Dollars, and the said Geo. A. Michael the sum of one hundred Dollars, of their respective goods and chattels, lands, and tenements, to be levied, and for the use of the commonwealth rendered; Yet upon this condition, that if the said Scott Horse shall for a term of twelve months from the date hereof, be of good behavior towards the commonwealth, and all persons therein, and in respect to selling by retail wine, ardent spirits and mixtures thereof, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
