

Rockingham County: to wit:

Be it remembered, that on this the 1st day of July 1902
Wm. Strother personally appeared before me C. E. Floyd
a justice of said county, and acknowledged
himself to owe the commonwealth of Virginia, the
sum of Two Hundred Dollars of her good and
chattels, lands and tenements, to be levied, and
for the use of the commonwealth rendered:

Yet upon this condition that whereas David
Byrd and Thomas Byrd was upon the 17th day
of May 1902 tried before me C. E. Floyd a justice
of said county for a misdemeanor, in this
that they did on the 15th day of January 1902
unlawfully carry away a quantity of wood
and timber then upon the lands of, and
belonging to Chas. Y. Beard, and by me
adjudged guilty and fined $\$2.50$ each and
costs amounting to $\$4.25$ each, from which
said judgment and conviction the said
David Byrd and Thomas Byrd took an
appeal to the next term of the county court
of said county. Now if the said David
Byrd and Thomas Byrd shall personally
appear before the said county court, on the
first day of the next (July) term thereof, to
ansure the commonwealth for and

concerning the said offences, whereof they
have been found guilty and convicted by
me, and shall not thence depart without
leave of the said court, then this recognizance
shall be void, otherwise to remain in full
force and virtue.
