Be it remembered, that on this 31st day of May 1902, Robert Derror and E. S. Sheets ^{Counties respectively,} of Augusta & Rockingham, personally appeared before me, Wm. J. Poindexter, a Justice of said County, and severally acknowledged themselves to owe the Commonwealth of Virginia, the said Robert Derror, the sum of ~~two hundred & fifty~~ dollars, and the said E. S. Sheets the sum of ~~two hundred & fifty~~ dollars, of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements to be levied, and for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition, that if the said Robert Derror shall, for a term of twelve months from the date hereof, be of good behavior towards the Commonwealth, and all persons therein, in every respect, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

And as to this obligation, we do, each, hereby waive the benefit of our Homestead Exemption, under the laws of the State of Virginia -

Whereas J. W. Glover has this day made complaint, on oath, before me, Wm. J. Poind, a Justice for said County, that Robert Derron, of Augusta County, Virginia, is not of good fame and behavior, but is demeaning and conducting himself in a scandalous and disgraceful manner, contrary to good morals and against the public peace, by very disorderly conduct, near and around the premises of affiant, in said County of Rockingham, and especially, on the 22nd day of May, 1902, by firing a pistol in an aggravating, near the house of affiant, in said County of Rockingham; and the said J. W. Glover has prayed that the said Robert Derron give surety for his good behavior;

There are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend the said Robert Derron and bring him before me, at No. 123, North Main Street, in Harrisonburg, Va; to answer the said complaint, and further to be dealt with, according to law.
