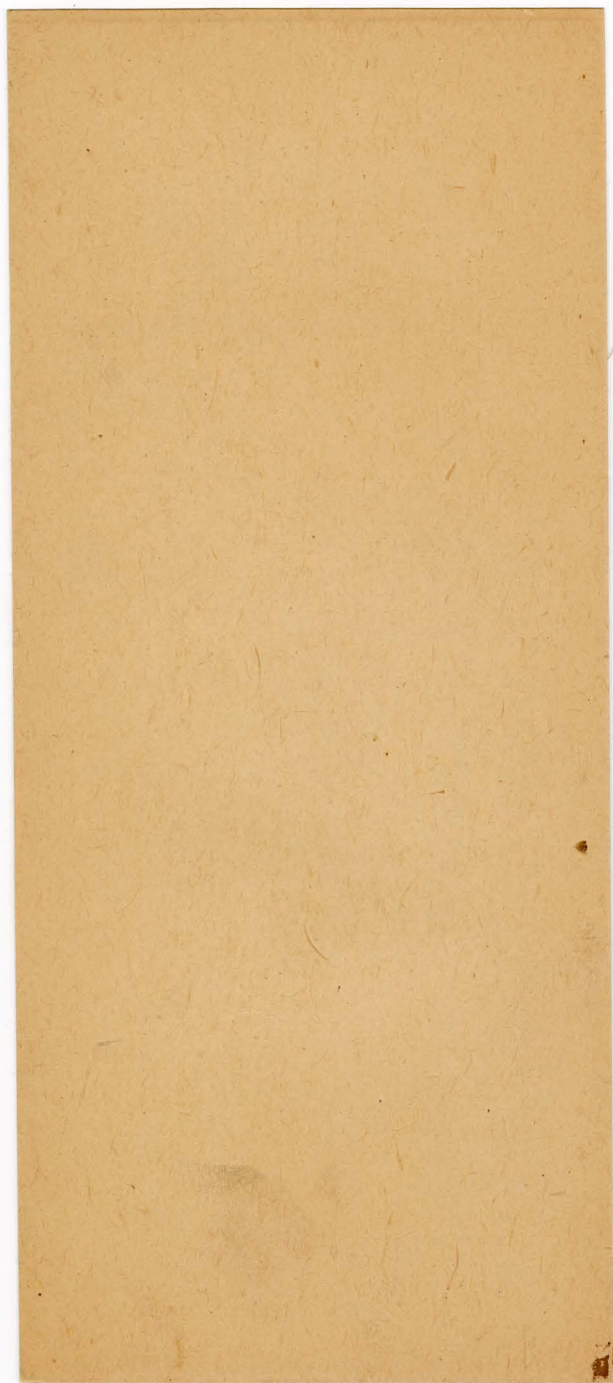

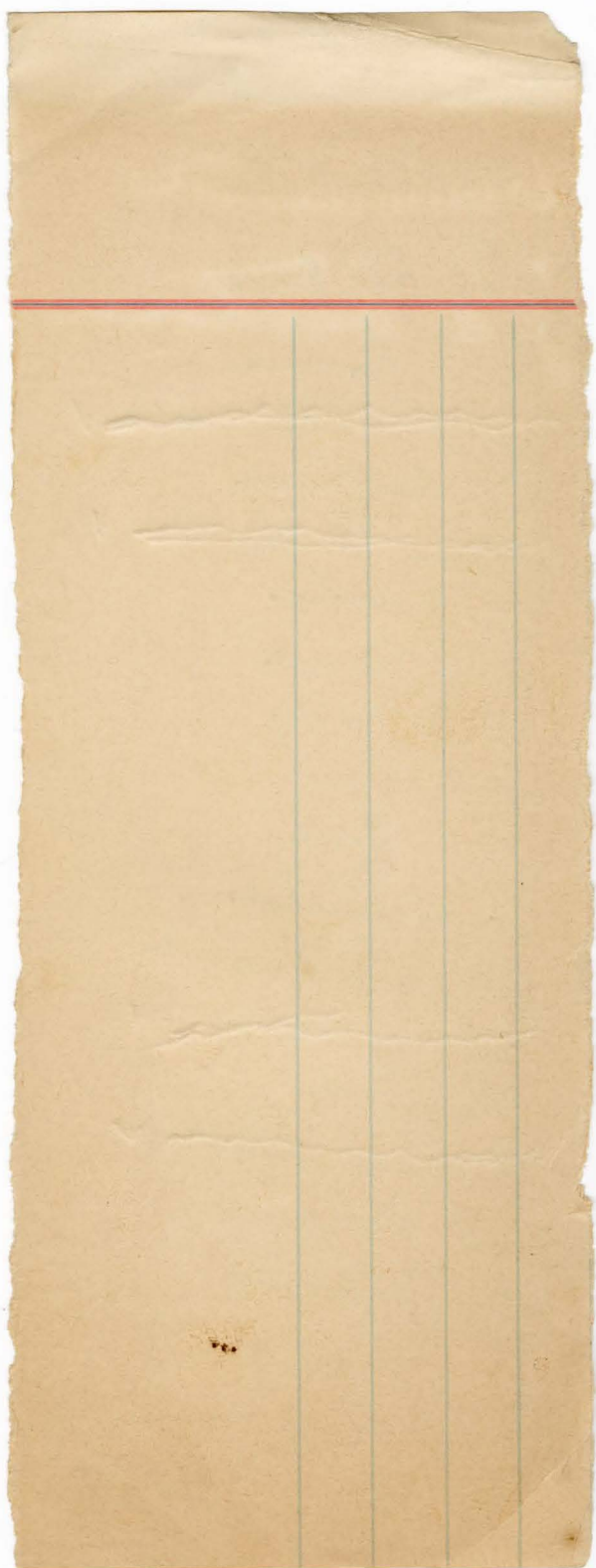

The Court-instructs the jury that
in use of the words reasonable doubt
in these instructions is meant that the
~~Reasonable~~ doubt - must be based
upon the evidence, or that is
suggested by the evidence, or grows
out of the evidence itself. It must
not be an arbitrary doubt without
evidence to sustain it. It must
be serious and substantial in order
to warrant an acquittal. It must be
a doubt of a material fact or
facts necessary for the jury to
believe to find a verdict of
conviction and not of immaterial
and non essential circumstances



If you find the prisoner not-guilty you will say so + no more.

If you find the prisoner guilty of forging the check of Mary A. Dixon for \$150. described in the indictment - or guilty of uttering or attempting to supply as true said check knowing the same to be forged, in manner & form as charged in the indictment - you will say so & ascertain his punishment - which shall be confinement in the penitentiary not less than two nor more than ten years.

Allhouse, with intent thereby to defraud against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.

And the grand jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that the said J. R. Allhouse on the 14th day of May in the year 1904 did feloniously utter and attempt to employ the said check purporting to be the check of Mary A. Dixon dated May 14th 1904 upon the Rockingham National Bank of Harrisonburg, Va. for the payment of One Hundred & fifty Dollars payable to the order of said J. R. Allhouse, as a true and genuine check to the said J. R. Allhouse then & there well knowing the same to be forged, with intent thereby to defraud,

against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
