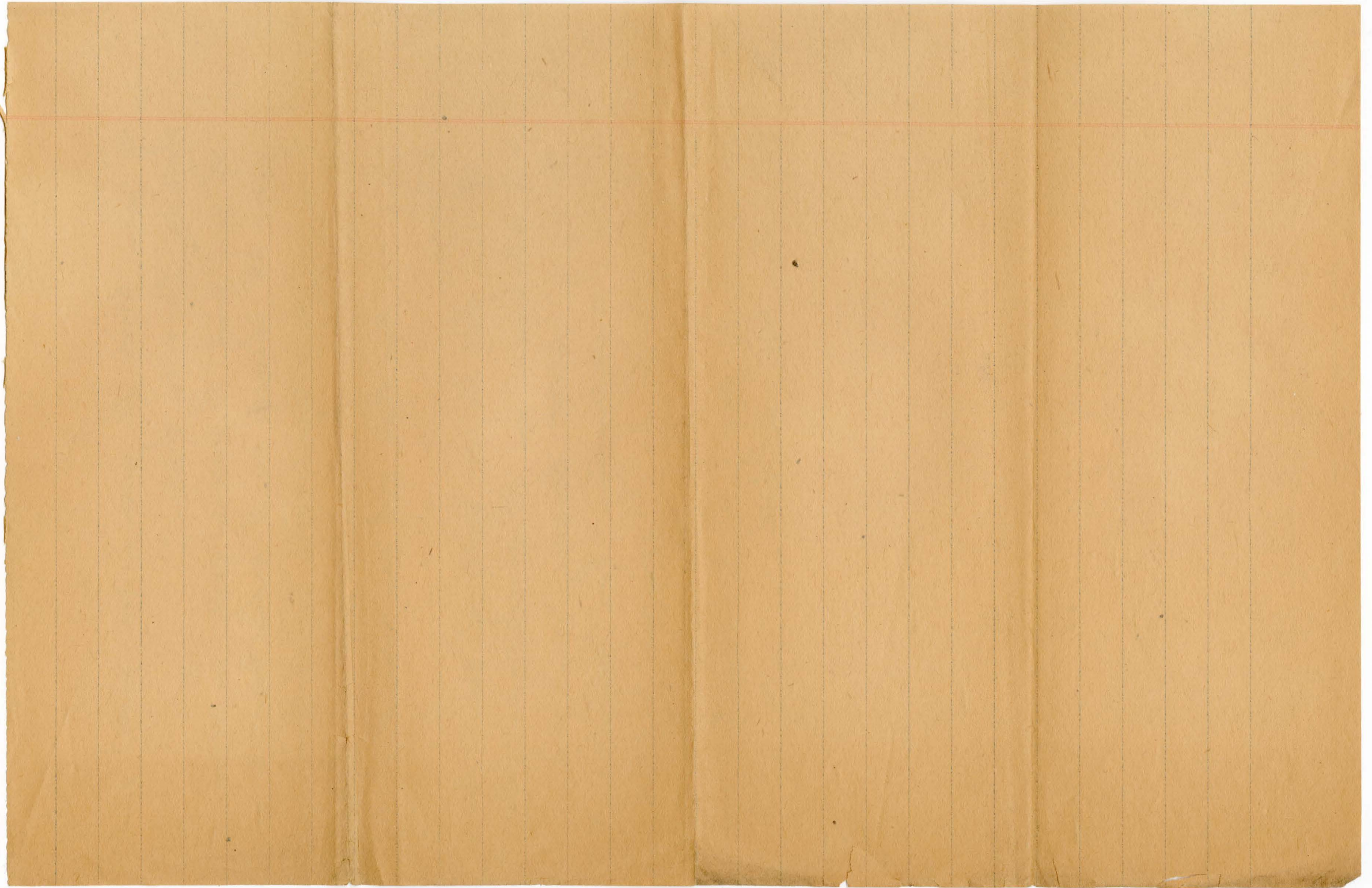

If you find the prisoner not-guilty- you will say so + no more.

If you find the prisoner guilty- in manner + form as charged in the indictment- you will say so + ascertain his punishment- which shall be confinement- in the penitentiary not-less than one nor more than ten years.

If you find him not-guilty- of grand larceny as charged in the indictment- but guilty of petit larceny you will say so + ascertain his punishment- which shall be confinement-in jail not-less than 15-days nor more than six months or by fine of not less than \$5⁰⁰ nor more than \$100. or both.

To the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Rockingham

I have this day (upon the testimony of H. C. Hale and H. S. Willard) committed to the jail of Rockingham County the body of Moffett Butler alias Moffett Minstead, to answer an indictment should one be found by the grand jury of said Court at the September term 1905 for a felony with which he stands charged in this that the said Moffett Butler alias Minstead on the 24th day of June 1905 did in said County being first duly sworn by H. C. Hale a Justice of the Peace for said County on the hearing then and there had before the said Justice H. C. Hale of a warrant against said Butler alias Minstead wherein said Butler alias Minstead was charged with a felony to wit with stealing from one Jacob Hoover on the 3^d day of June 1905 certain money, namely three Bank notes for the payment and value of \$20.⁰⁰ each, two Bank notes for the payment and value of \$10.⁰⁰ each and one Bank note for the payment and value of \$2.⁰⁰, the said H. C. Hale as Justice of the Peace aforesaid then and there having competent authority to administer the said oath did then and there unlawfully wilfully and corruptly swear falsely on the hearing aforesaid before said H. C. Hale Justice of the Peace as aforesaid touching a matter then and there material to be enquired into, in this that he the said Moffett Butler alias Moffett

Milstead swore that a \$10.00 bill which he has
in possession on the night of June 4th 1905 - had
been received by him from Cora Lawrence whereas
in truth and fact the said testimony was false
and untrue.

Hale, justice of the peace as aforesaid, of and on a warrant of arrest against said Moffett Butler alias Moffett Milstead wherein said Moffett Butler alias Moffett Milstead was charged with a felony, to wit, with stealing from one Jacob Hoover on the 3rd day of June 1905 in the County aforesaid certain money, namely three bank notes for the payment of and of the value of \$20.00 each, two bank notes for the payment and of the value of \$10.00 each and one bank note for the payment and of the value of \$2.00, the said H. C. Hale, justice as aforesaid then and there having competent authority to administer said oath, did then and there upon his oath aforesaid, and touching a matter then and there material to be enquired into, feloniously, willfully and corruptly swear falsely and testify, among other things, that a ten dollar bill which he had in his possession on the night of the 3rd day of June 1905 had been received by him from one Cora Lavender whereas in truth and fact the said ten dollar bill was not received by him from said Cora Lavender, whereby the said Moffett Butler alias Moffett Milstead did then and there in the manner and form aforesaid, feloniously, willfully and corruptly swear falsely and thereby feloniously commit willful and corrupt perjury

against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
