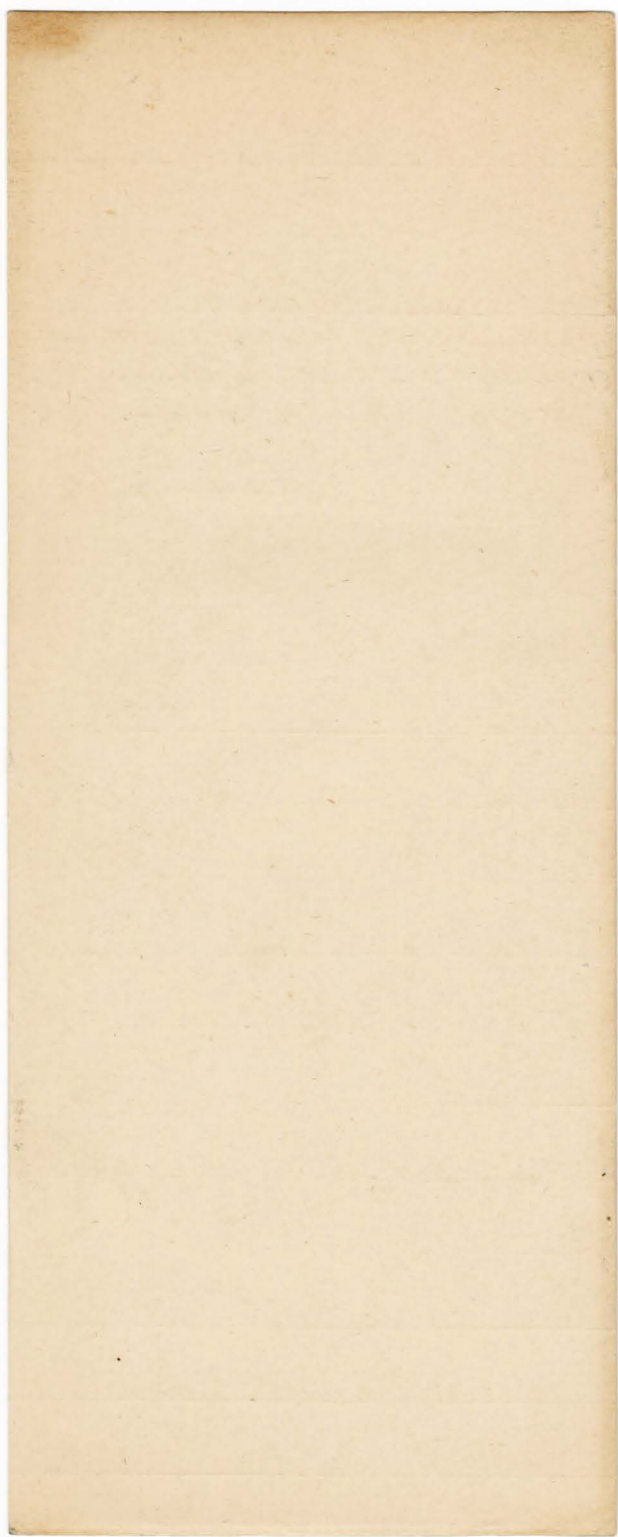

of the said county, on the 26th day of March 1906, in the said county, did

being then and there duly sworn by Wm. J. Poole, a Justice of the Peace, for said County, to testify and to speak on the examining trial, then and there had before said Wm. J. Poole, Justice of the Peace as aforesaid, of any and all warrants of arrest against Wade H. Siles, wherein said Wade H. Siles was charged with a felony to wit with stealing from C. W. Heaton on Dec. 29, 1905, in the County aforesaid, certain furs, namely nine legs of the value of \$50.00 or more the said Wm. J. Poole, Justice as aforesaid, then and there being competent and lawful to administer said oath, did then and there

upon his oath aforesaid, and touching a matter then and there material, to be enquired into, feloniously, willfully and corruptly swear falsely and testify, among other things that he, the said Jacob Armentrout, heard a conversation in Harrisonburg, Virginia, on the 18th day of December 1905, that being Court day, between Wade H. Siles and one F. Pierre Sprinkle, wherein said Siles was offering to trade said Sprinkle legs for dogs, whereas, in truth and in fact the said Jacob Armentrout was not in Harrisonburg, Virginia, on the 18th day of December 1905, and did not hear the aforesaid conversation between said Siles and said Sprinkle, in the town aforesaid where the said Jacob Armentrout did then and there, in the manner and form aforesaid, feloniously, willfully and corruptly swear falsely, and thereby feloniously commit wilful and corrupt perjury -

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said

to answer the said complaint, and to be farther dealt with according to law. And you are required to summon

be fined the sum of \$25.⁰⁰ and the costs
of this prosecution, and be confined in
the jail of Rockingham County, Va. for
the period of three months, and thereafter
until the said fine and costs are paid,
or he be otherwise discharged according
to law, and I order J. A. Surtzger, Sheriff
of said County, to execute this judg-
ment. But the said Jacob Armentrout
having prayed an appeal from this
judgment to the Circuit Court of said
County, and he having entered into a
recognizance, with David Armentrout, his
surety, who justified, in the penalty of \$250.⁰⁰

conditioned as the law directs, for his personal
appearance before said Court, on the first
day of the next Term thereof, then and there
to answer for the said offence, an appeal
is granted him, according to law; and
the execution of said judgment is suspen-
ded, and said Jacob Armentrout is
discharged from custody - And the
