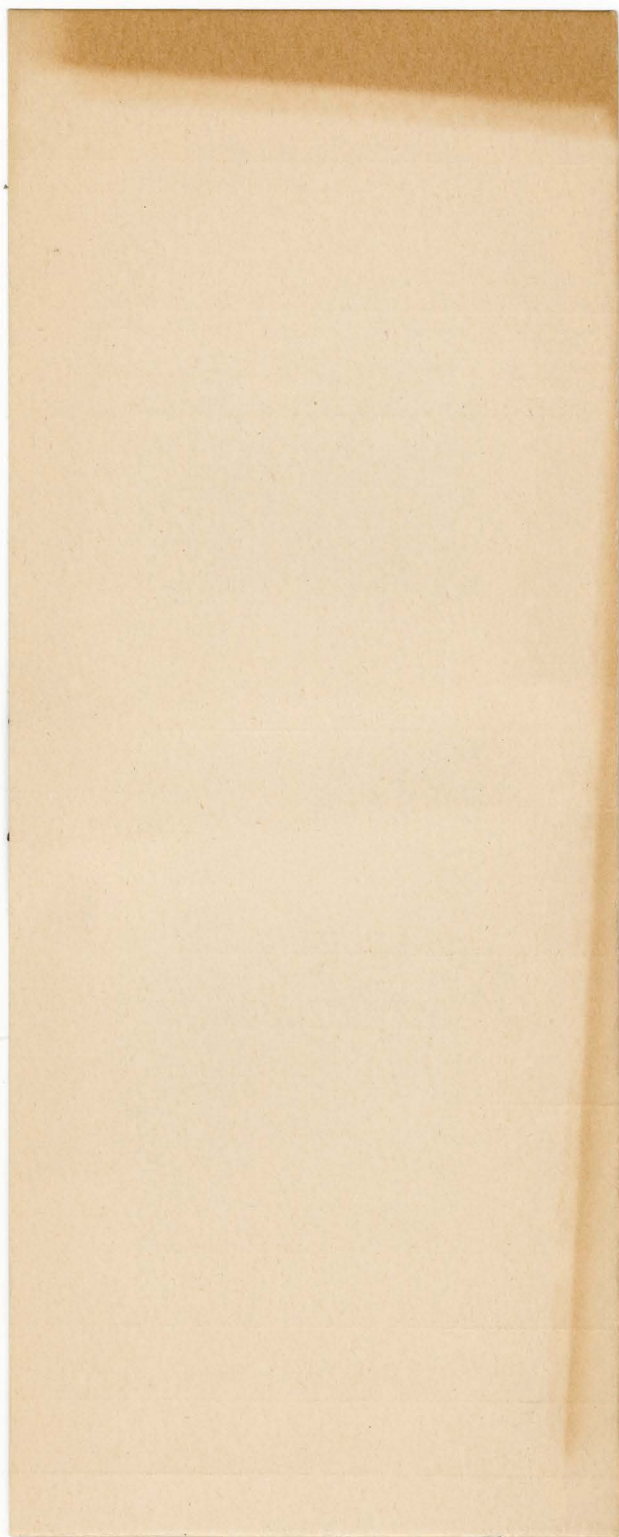

If you find the prisoner not-guilty you will say so and no more.

If you find the prisoner guilty of breaking and entering the chicken house of P.O. Sullivan in manner & form as charged in the indictment you will say so and ascertain the punishment which may be confinement in the penitentiary not less than one year nor more than ten years or in discretion of the jury confined in jail not exceeding twelve months & fined not exceeding five hundred dollars.

If you find the prisoner not-guilty of the felony aforesaid but-guilty of simple larceny you will say so and ascertain his punishment which shall be confinement in jail not less than fifteen days nor more than six months or by fine not less than five dollars nor more than \$100. or both.
