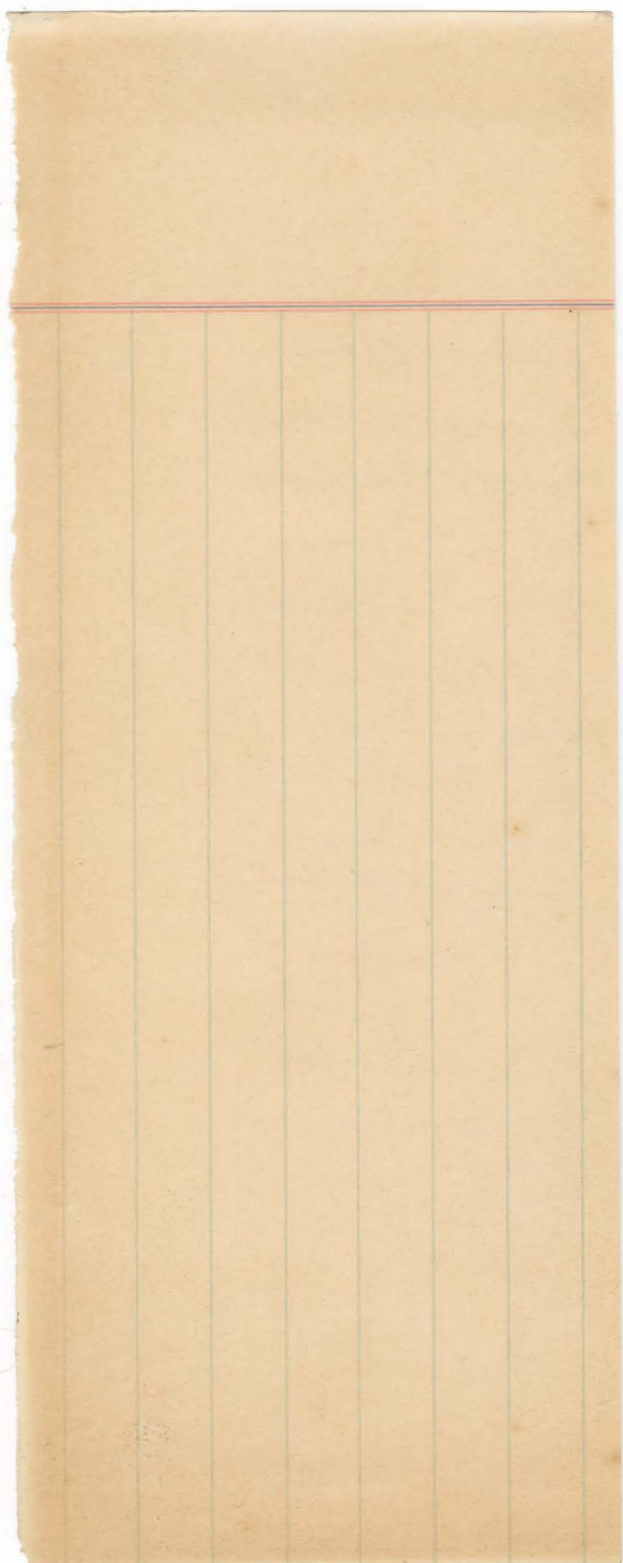

If you find the prisoner not-guilty - you will say so and no more.

If you find the prisoner ~~not~~-guilty of breaking and entering in the night-time or day time the January, as charged in the indictment - with intent to commit larceny therein, you will say so and ascertain his punishment - which shall be confinement in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than 10 years or confined in jail not exceeding 12 months and fined not exceeding \$500.

If you find the prisoner not-guilty of the felony aforesaid but-guilty of larceny as charged in the indictment you will say so and ascertain his punishment - which shall be fine of not less than \$500 or confinement in jail or both.
