he is unlawfully detained in the custody of John A. Switzer, Sheriff

Sheriff, committing your petitioner to said Sheriff, to be by him
carried to the County of Albemarle, there to be taken before a
Justice of said last named County to be further proceeded against
touching a certain alleged offense set out in a certain warrant
issued on the 29th day of August, 1907, by said Wm. J. Points, J.
P., upon the basis of a written affidavit of one W. H. McCue, upon
whose complaint said warrant issued.

Your petitioner represents that, conceding the facts set
forth said affidavit whereon said warrant issued to be true, the

Upon which promises said two mares and colts were delivered by affiant to said Edward Lee- but said Lee has failed and still fails to comply with said promises, but instead thereof has sold said mares and colts to a trader in Rockingham Co., Va., and has converted the proceeds thereof to his own use and benefit.

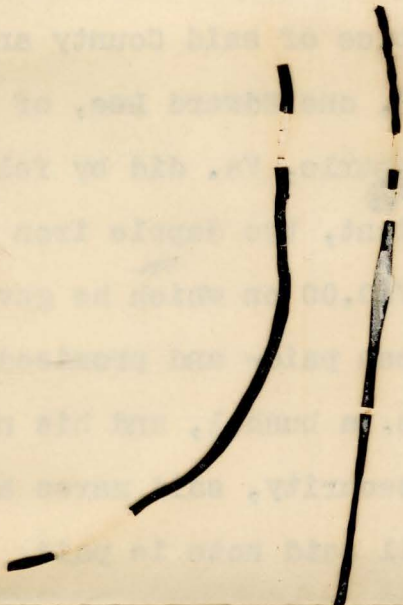
