unlawfully and feloniously break and enter a freight car, standing upon the track of the Chesapeake Western Railway, ^(a corporation) at the Depot in ^{with intent to commit larceny, larceny & the} Harrisonburg, in said County, and take, steal and carry away therefrom a quantity of merchandise, to-wit: gun coats, gumboots, gunn hats, two boxes of crackers, a quantity of cigarettes, and other goods, of a value ^{#30} ~~exceeding \$50.00~~, then and there being the property of said Chesapeake Western Railway (a Corporation).

These are therefore in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me or some other Justice the body of the said Norman K. Loving to answer the said complaint and to be further dealt with according to law.



CERTIFICATE OF COMMITMENT FOR TRIAL.

VIRGINIA, COUNTY OF ROCKINGHAM---To-wit:

To the Clerk of the Circuit Court of said County:

I, *W. J. Pirut*, a justice of the peace of said county, do hereby certify that I have this day committed *Norman K. Loving* to the jail of said county, that he may be tried before the circuit court of said county, for a felony by him committed, in this, that he, on the *11th* day of *August*, 190*7*, in the said county, *did* unlawfully and feloniously break & enter a freight car, standing upon the tracks of the C. & W. R. R. Co. (a Corporation) at the Depot in Harrisonburg, in said County, with intent to commit Larceny therein; and he, the said *Norman K. Loving*, then and there did feloniously take & steal and carry away therefrom a quantity of merchandize to wit; gunn coats, gunn boots, gunn hats, two boxes of crackers & a quantity of cigarettes & other goods, of the value of \$30.00, then and there became the property of the said *Chesapeake & Western Railroad Company* (a Corporation).

Morrison K. Loving

The Court instructs the jury that

If you find the prisoner not guilty - you will say so and no more.

If you find the prisoner guilty of Louse breaking in manner & form as charged in the indictment - you will say so and ascertain his punishment - which shall be confinement in the penitentiary not less than one year nor than ten years or in your discretion confinement in jail not exceeding twelve months & fined not exceeding \$500.

If you find the prisoner not guilty of the felony charged in the indictment - but guilty of petit larceny you will say so and ascertain his punishment - which shall be confinement in jail not less than 15 days nor more than 6 months or by fine not less than \$500 nor more than \$100 - or both.

Loving, two boxes of crackers, several boxes of cigarettes, several gum coats, and gum hats and gum boots of the value in all of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) of the goods and chattels of the said Chesapeake Railway, a corporation, in said car then and there being did feloniously steal, take and carry away against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.

Loving on the 11th day of August, 1907, in the said County, in the night time of said date, a certain Railroad car the property of the Chesapeake-Western Railway, a corporation, then and there being feloniously did break and enter with intent the goods and chattels of the said Chesapeake-Western Railway, a corporation, in said car then and there being feloniously to steal, take and carry away ^{and} two boxes of crackers, two boxes of cigarettes, several gum coats, gum boots and gum hats of the value of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) in all of the goods and chattels of the said Chesapeake-Western Railway then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away,

against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
