The condition of the above recognizance is

according to law; from which judgment
the said Samuel Mason has taken an
Appeal to the Circuit Court of the
said County,

Now if the above named Samuel
Mason shall appear before the said
Circuit Court on the first day of
the next term thereof to answer
the Commonwealth for and concerning
the said offence whereof he has been
found guilty and convicted by me
and shall not thence depart without
the leave of the said Court, then this
recognizance shall be void otherwise
to remain in full force and virtue.


