COMMITMENT TO ANSWER INDICTMENT.

VIRGINIA, COUNTY OF ROCKINGHAM---TO-WIT:

To the Chief of Police of Harrisonburg of said County, and to the Keeper of the Jail thereof:

These are, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you, the said Chief forthwith to convey and deliver into the custody of the keeper of said jail, together with this warrant, the body of.....

did unlawfully and feloniously enter an out house on the premises of W. H. Roberson, and take, steal and carry away one Bicycle of the value of \$16.00, then and there being the property of said W. H. Roberson, and being found probably guilty, was sent on to the Circuit Court of Rockingham County Va for trial

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham, and now attending the said Court, UPON THEIR OATH PRESENT, that W. N. Robinson on the 10th day of January in the year 1909, in the said county, a certain outhouse, called a Wash Louse the property of one W. Thomas Robinson not adjoining to or occupied with the dwelling-house of the said W. Thomas Robinson there situated in the night time of that day, feloniously did break and enter, with intent the goods and chattles of the said W. J. Robinson in the said outhouse then and there being, feloniously to steal, take and carry away. And one bicycle of the value of Sixteen Dollars

of the goods and chattles of the said Paul Robinson in the said outhouse, then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
