Neff, a Justice of the Peace of the said County, that John Ford, Frank Ford, Flegm Reedy and George Reedy, on the 27th day of January, 1910, in the said County of Rockingham, did, without permission of him the said Selestine Whitmer, pull down and leave open a certain fence, of which the said Selestine Whitmer was then the owner, on the lands of the said Whitmer, contrary to the statute in that case made and provide the said John Ford, Frank Ford, Flegm Reedy and Geo. Reedy on the day aforesaid, in the County aforesaid, unlawfully, but not feloniously, destroy, injure, deface, take and carry away personal property not their own, to-wit five fence rails, the property of the said Selestine Whitmer. These are therefore in the name of the Commonwealth to command you forthwith to apprehend the said John Ford, Frank Ford, Flegm Reedy and George Reedy and bring them before me, or some other Justice of the Peace of the said County, to be dealt with according to law.

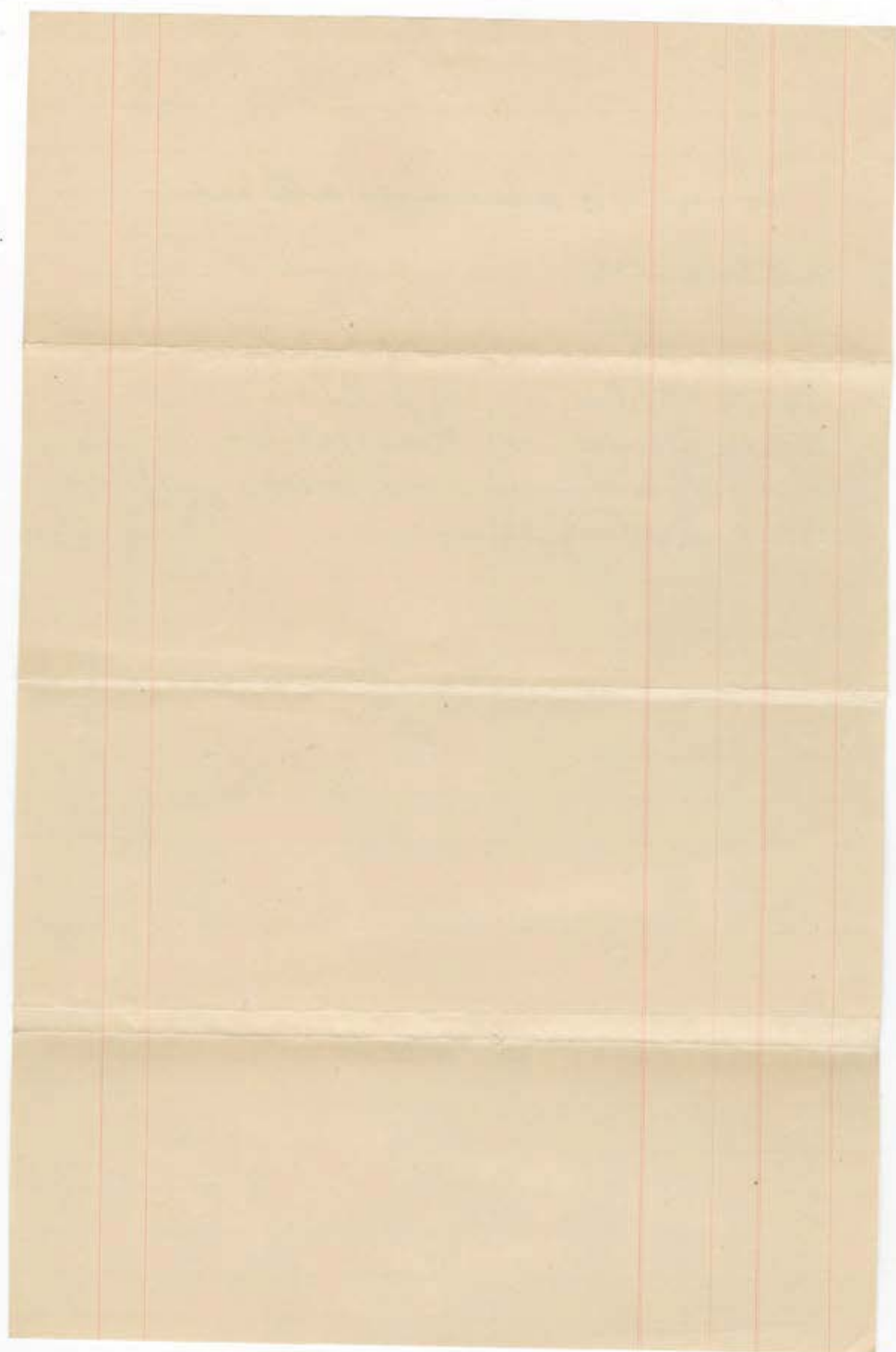

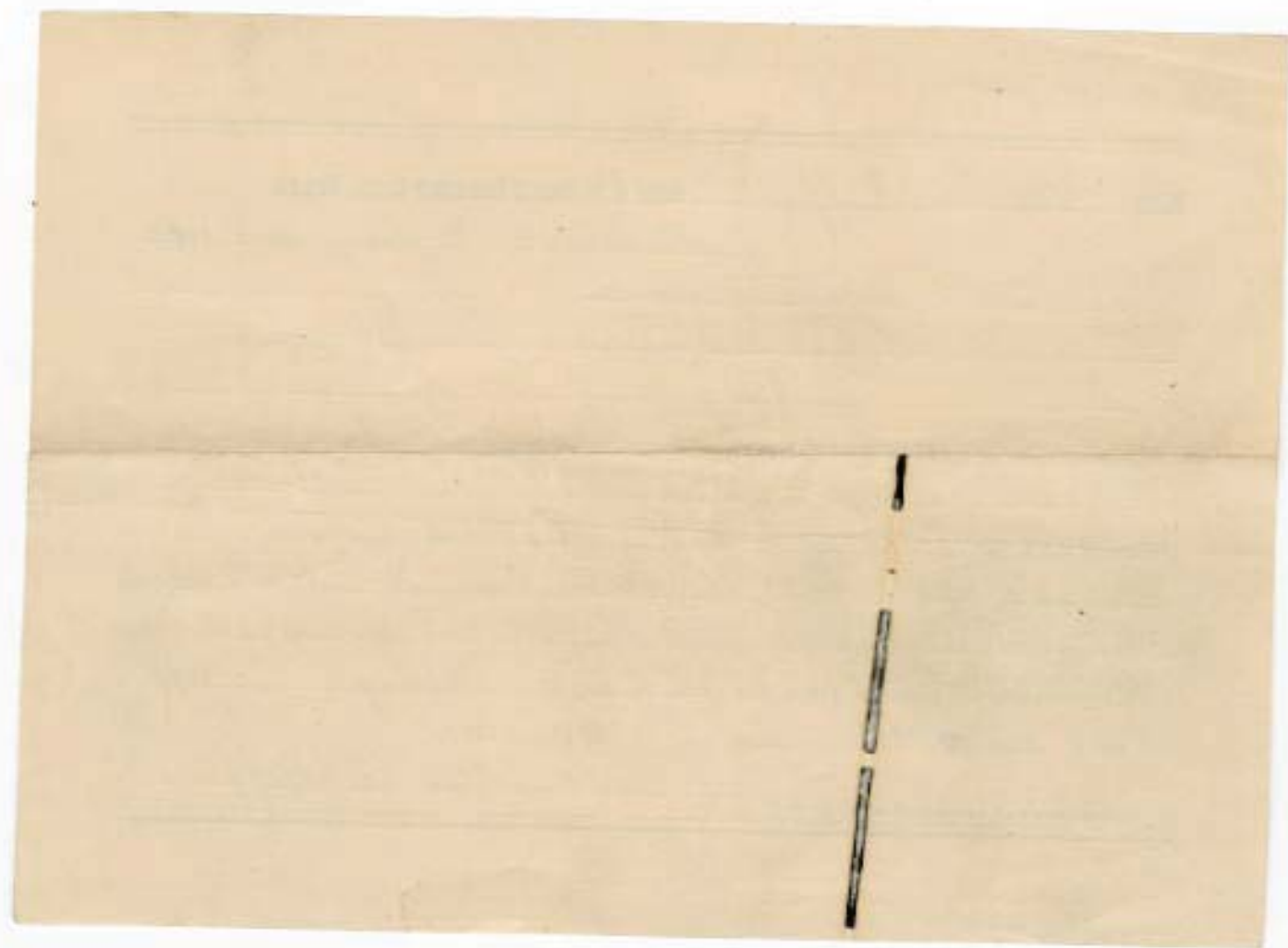
