respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, and they severally waived the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this obligation, and also waived any claim or right to discharge any

liability to the Commonwealth arising under this recognizance with coupons detached from the bonds of this State,

to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia if the said William E. Holsinger

shall make default in the performance of the conditions underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound William E.

Holsinger do and shall personally appear before the Circuit Court of Rockingham

on the 3rd day of the February Term next thereof, being the 1911 day of

1897 at the Court-house thereof, and then and there answer a bill of indictment

against him by the Grand Jury in and for said County against him the said William E.

Holsinger for a felony by him committed, for

unlawfully and feloniously forging a certain promissory note

purporting to be signed by R. T. Welch and to be

negotiable and payable at the First National Bank

of Harrisburg Pa in manner & form as set out in said

indictment whereof the said William E. Holsinger stands charged, and shall not

depart thence without the leave of said Court, then the above recognizance shall be void and of no effect, otherwise

to remain in full force and virtue.

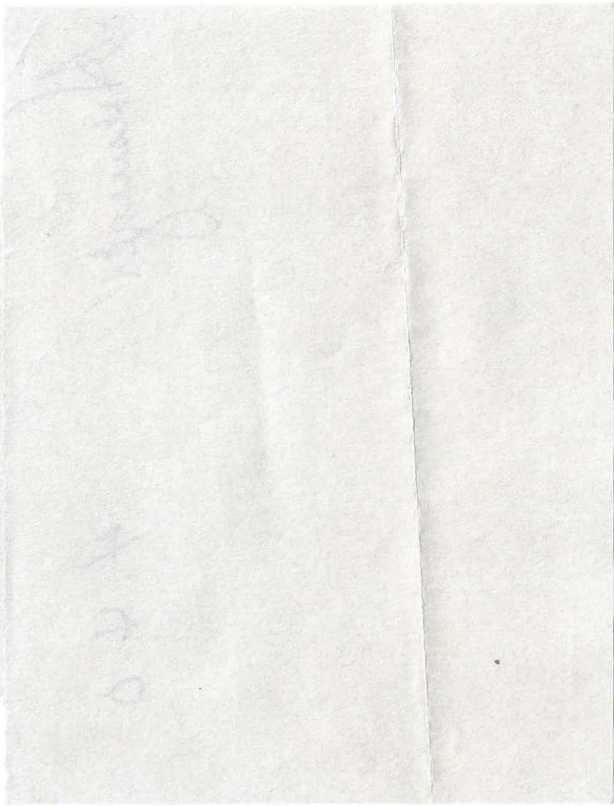

(Signed) R. J. Welch", with intent to defraud, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

as true a certain other forged promissory note payable
and payable at the First National Bank of Harrisonburg
at Harrisonburg, Va which said last-mentioned note

is of the following purport and effect, to wit,
\$110⁰⁰. Harrisonburg, Va May 17th 1910.

Four months after date I promise to pay to the
order of W. E. Holsinger One Hundred + Ten dollars
in the year 190 in the said County
for value received negotiable and payable at
the First National Bank of Harrisonburg, at Harrison-
burg, Va without effect and we the drawer and
endorsers each hereby waive the benefit of our
Homestead Exemption as to this debt. (Signed) R. J. Welch
with intent to defraud to the said William E
Holsinger at the time he so uttered and attempted
to employ as true the said last-mentioned forged
note, to wit, on the day and year last-mentioned
in the County aforesaid, well knowing the same to be
forged

against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
