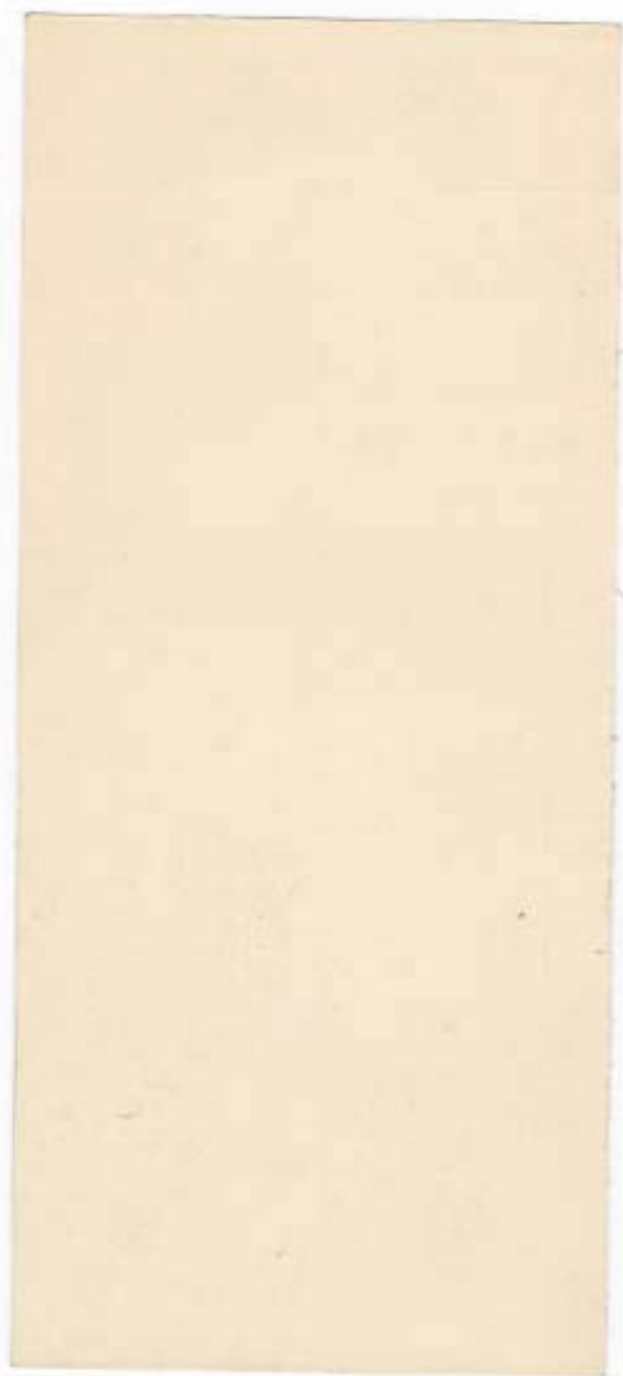

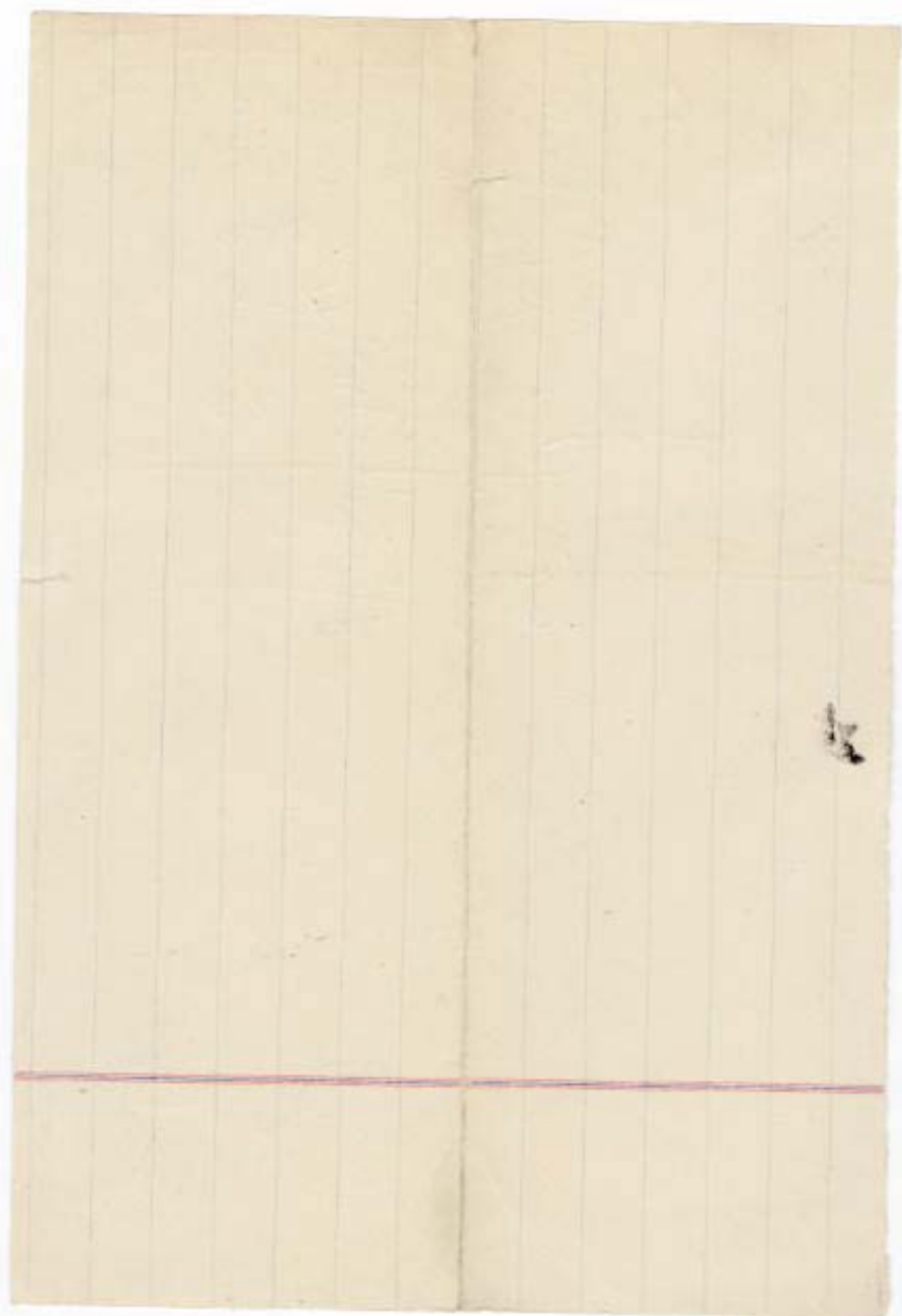

THAT WE Joseph Jackson and J.W. Dulapens

are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the sum of five hundred DOLLARS.

to the true payment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated the 7th day of February 1911, and in the 133rd year of the Commonwealth, and we, and each of us hereby waive the benefit of the Homestead exemption as to the obligation of this bond, also any claim or right to discharge any liability to the Commonwealth arising under said bond or by virtue of said office, post, or trust, with Coupons detached from bonds of this State.

The condition of the above obligation is such, That Whereas the above bound Joseph Jackson was on the 3rd day of February 1911 Councils in the Circuit Court of Rockingham County of a misdemeanour on the charge of selling a deed of his without having license so to do, and was thereupon required by the order of the Court to give bond as required by the Statute for such cases made and printed: Now therefore if the said Joseph Jackson shall not, within twelve months from the date of said last mentioned order, bid in to say from the 7th day of February 1911, violate any of the provisions of the act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved March 15, 1910 and constituting Chapter 190 of the acts of the General Assembly of Virginia of 1910, then this bond shall be void otherwise to remain in full force and value
