WHEREAS, W. L. Henry of the said county, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, D. W. Barrman, a Justice of the said county, that Unknown parties of the said county, on the 29th day of January, 192, at Stone Spring Crossing in the said county, did maliciously and feloniously throw a stone ^{at} Baltimore & Ohio Train Number 94, a mixed freight and passenger train, whereby the life of Dr. John E. Womack, a passenger on said train was endangered:

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to summon to appear before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the said unknown parties to answer the said complaint, and to be farther dealt with according to law. And you are required to summon to appear and give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth, on the examination touching the said offence.
