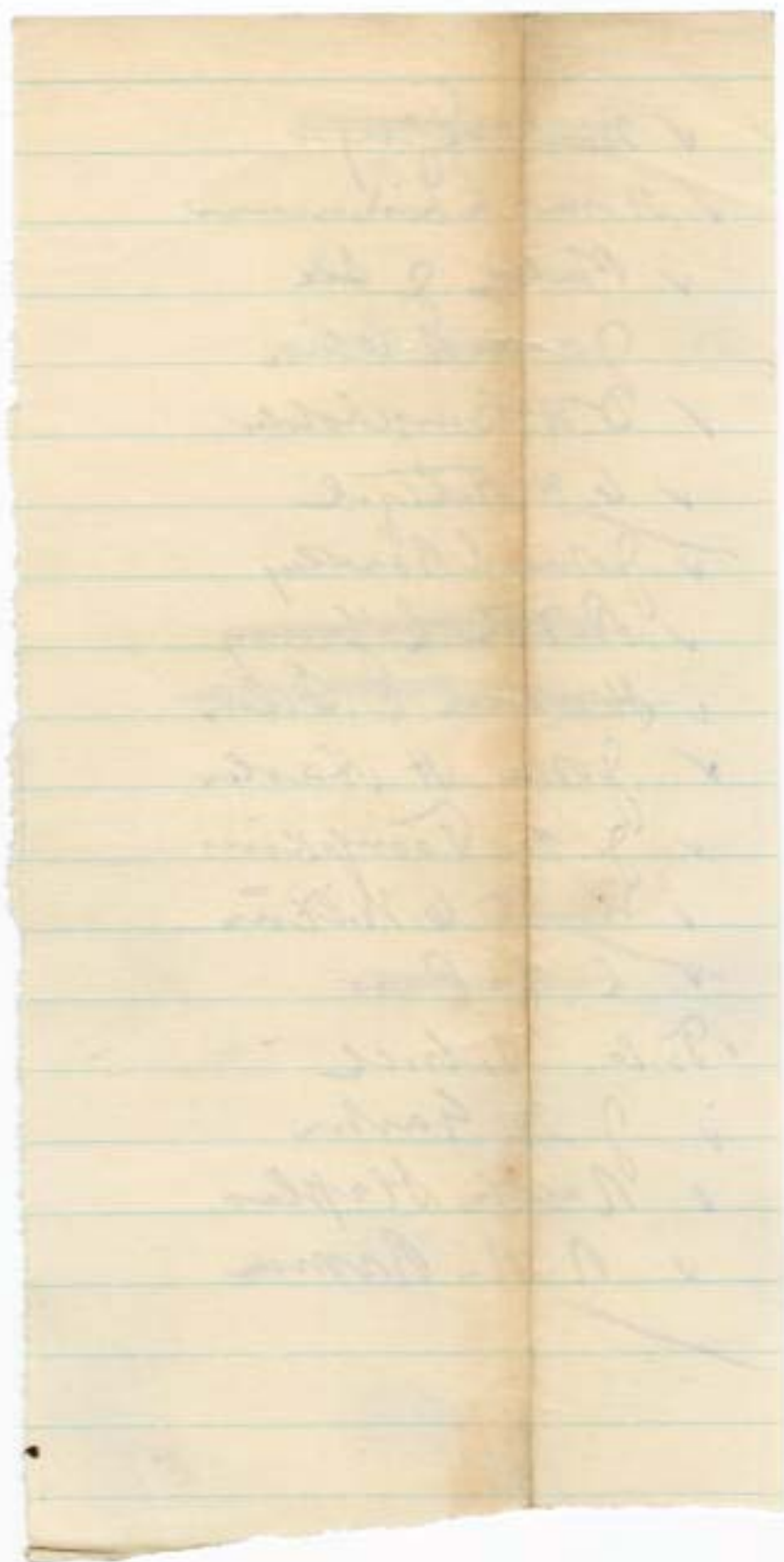

To The Sheriff a Constable of said County:

WHEREAS, D. E. Croushorn of the said county, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, D. W. Earman a Justice of the said county, that

J. R. Barton of the said county, on the 15th day of April 1912, in the said county, did unlawfully and <sup>maliciously</sup> feloniously commit an assault upon one Walter O. Rhodes by striking him on the head with a chair, with the intent to

main, disable, disfigure ~~and~~ kill him the said Walter O. Rhodes.

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said

J. R. Barton to answer the said complaint, and to be farther dealt with according to law. And you are required to summon

to appear and give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth, on the examination touching the said offence.

If you find him guilty of maliciously striking <sup>beating</sup> and wound-  
ing Walter O. Rhodes, with intent to maim, disfigure, disable, or  
kill as charged in the indictment you will say so, and then  
ascertain the term of his confinement in the penitentiary so  
that such term be not less than one nor more than ten  
years. If you find him not guilty of maliciously, but guilty  
of unlawfully striking <sup>beating</sup> and wounding Walter O. Rhodes, with  
intent to maim, disfigure, disable or kill as charged in the in-  
dictment you will say so, and then ascertain the term of his  
confinement in the penitentiary so that such term be not  
less than one nor more than five years, or his term of  
confinement in the County Jail not exceeding twelve months  
and his fine not exceeding five hundred dollars. If you  
find him not guilty of either of the felonies aforesaid but  
guilty of Assault and Battery you will say so, and then  
ascertain the term of his confinement in the County  
Jail and the amount of his fine, or either, so that  
such fine however, be not less than five dollars -

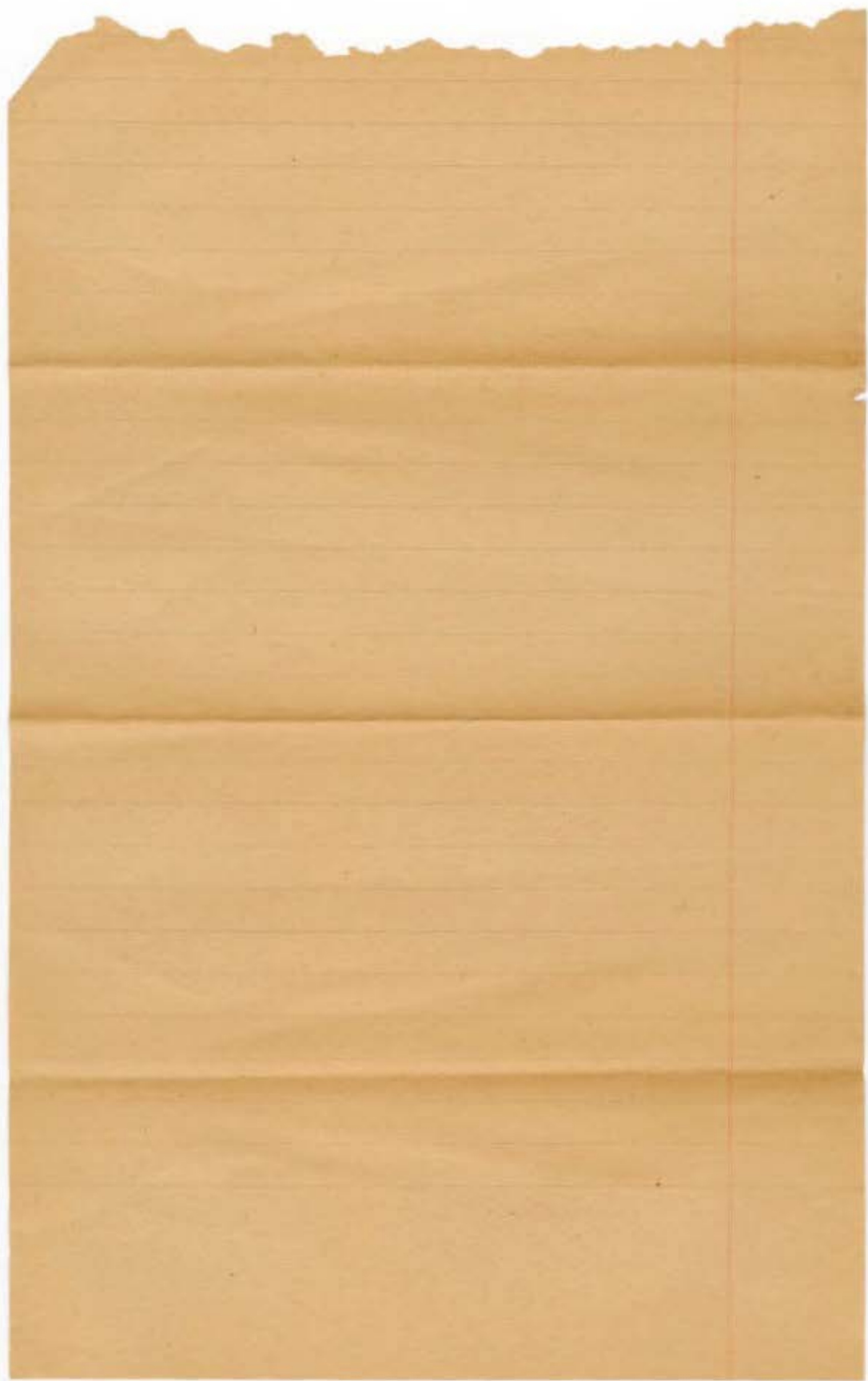

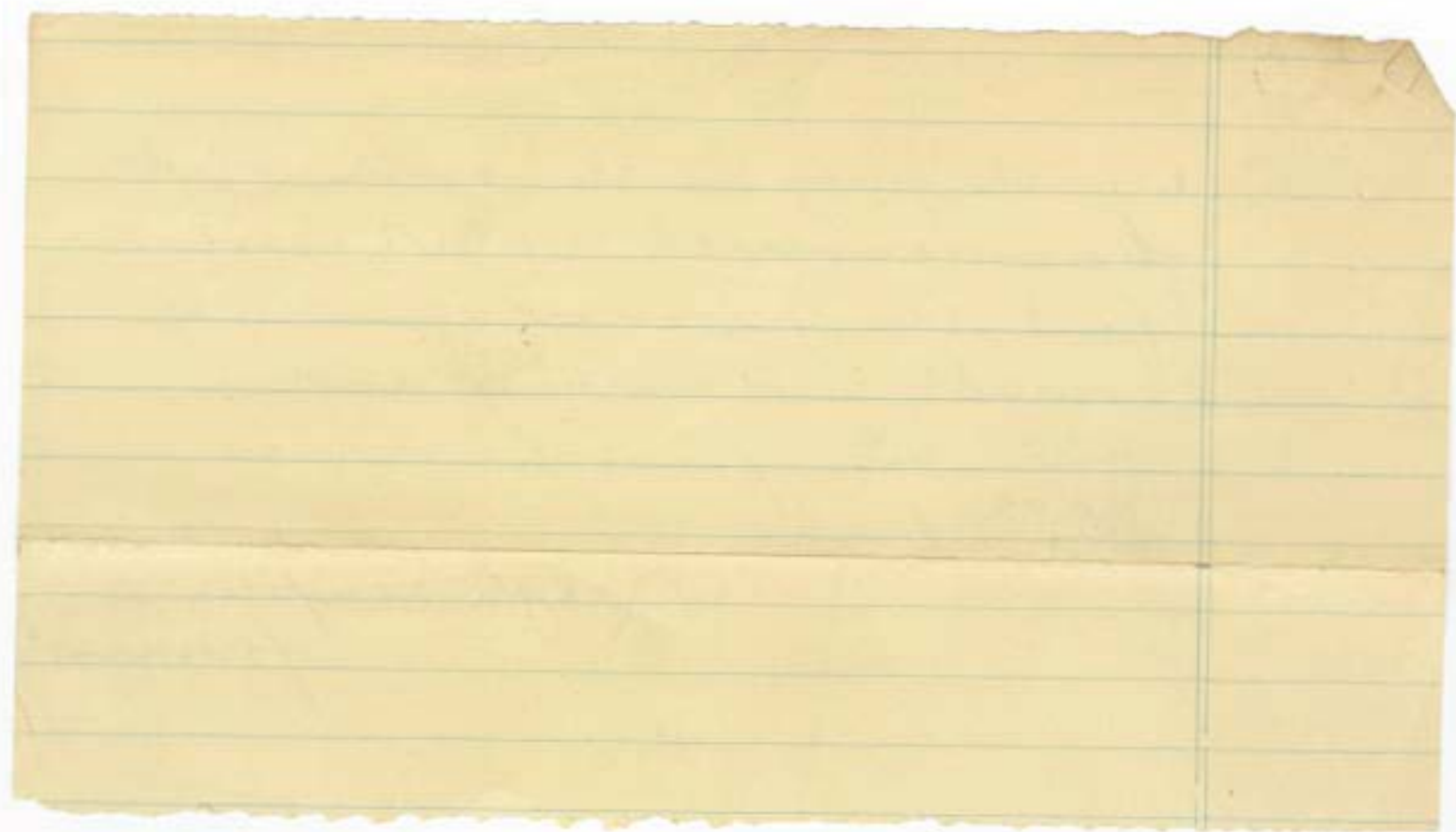

Be it remembered that on the 9th day of May, 1912, J. R. Barton and John E. Roller of said County, came before me, D. W. Earman, a Justice of the said County, and severally and respectively acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in manner and form following, that is to say: the said J. R. Barton in the sum of Five (\$500.00)<sup>Hundred</sup> dollars, good and lawful money of the United States, and the said John E. Roller in the sum of Five (\$500.00)<sup>Hundred</sup> dollars, of good and lawful money, to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia, if the said J. R. Barton shall make default in the performance of the condition underwritten. The said J. R. Barton and John E. Roller hereby waive the benefit of their exemption as to this obligation.

The condition of the above recognizance is such, that if the above bound J. R. Barton do and shall personally appear before the Circuit Court of Rockingham County on the first day of the next term thereof, then and there to answer the Commonwealth for and concerning a certain felony by him committed, in feloniously, maliciously and unlawfully committing an assault upon one Walter O. Rhodes by striking him on the head with a chair, with the intent to maim, disable and kill him the said Walter O. Rhodes, wherewith the said J. R. Barton stands charged, and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court, then the above recognizance shall be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
