If you find the prisoner guilty as charged in the indictment - you will say so and ascertain his punishment - which shall be confinement in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than ten years.

If you find the prisoner not guilty - <sup>striking Warren Davis</sup> as charged in the indictment - but guilty of unlawfully striking Warren Davis with intent to maim, disfigure, disable or kill said Davis you will say so and ascertain his punishment - which may be confinement in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than five years or confinement in jail not exceeding twelve months - and fined not exceeding \$500.

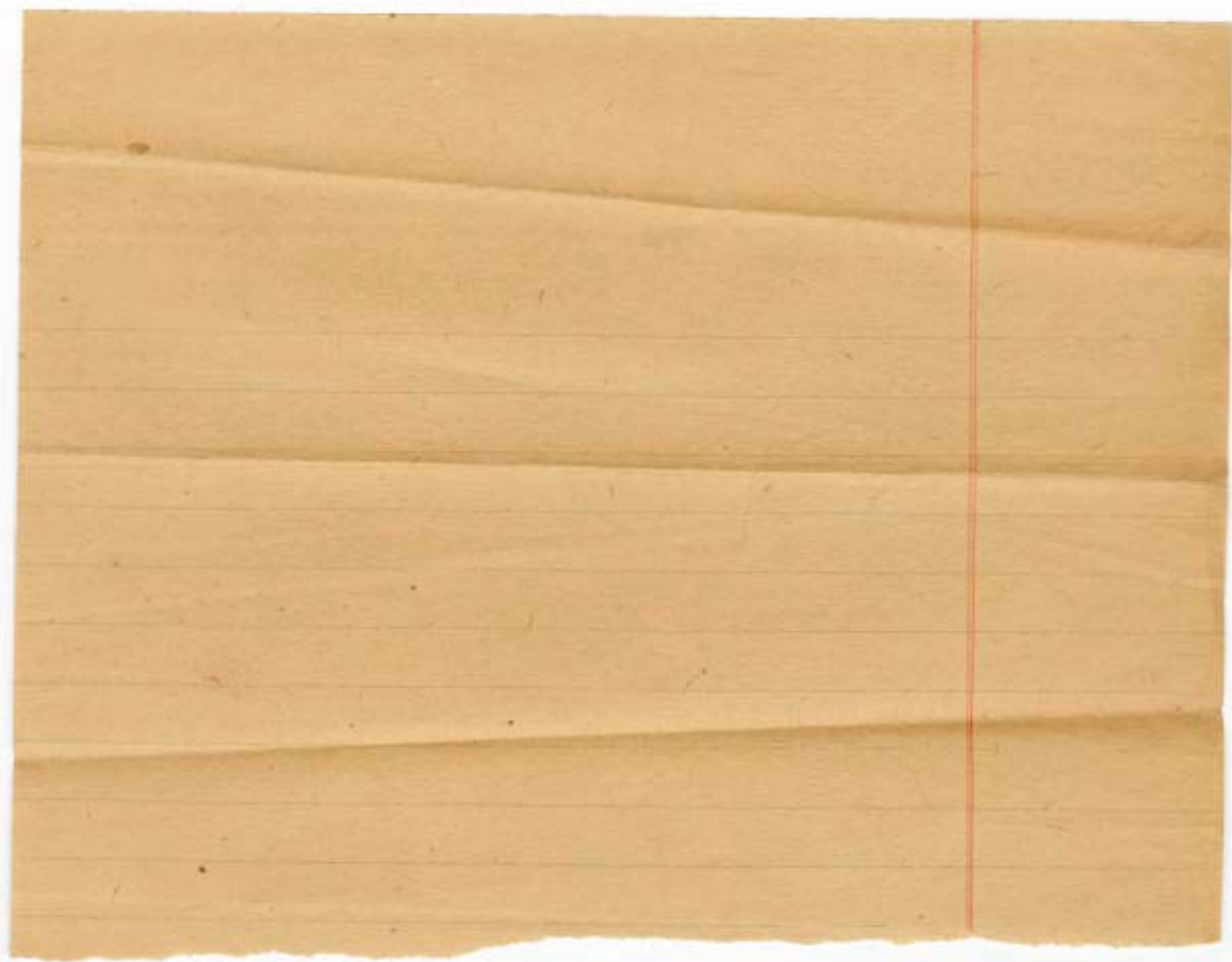
If you find the prisoner not guilty of either of the felonies aforesaid but guilty of assault and battery you will say so and ascertain his punishment - which shall be fine of not less than \$5.00 or confinement in jail or both.
