The jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham, and now attending the Circuit Court of said county, <sup>at its May term, 1916</sup> UPON THEIR OATHS PRESENT, that

Margaret Sipe on April 1, 1916, in said county, did unlawfully, maliciously and feloniously attempt to administer and did administer poison, known as strychnine, in a food known as candy, to one Lillie Kyger, by sending a box of said candy, in which the said Margaret Sipe had feloniously placed said strychnine poison, by United States mail, said box being addressed to said Lillie Kyger, who, on receiving same in due course of mail, opened it and proceeded to eat it when she discovered the said poison, thereby endangering the life of said Lillie Kyger, as well as that of her sister, Cora Kyger, who also did eat of said candy, innocently given to her by the said Lillie Kyger, with the felonious intent to injure and kill said Lillie Kyger,

against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

AND THE JURORS AFORESAID, UPON THEIR OATHS AFORESAID, DO FURTHER PRESENT, that

against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
