Charge to the Jury.

If the jury find the accused, Leighton, Griffith, and Charles Hensley, not guilty, they will say so and no more.

If you find them guilty of malicious assault <sup>as charged</sup> ~~as charged~~ and with intent charged in the indictment, you will say so and ascertain their punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for not less than 1 nor more than 10 years.

If you find them not guilty of malicious assault <sup>as charged</sup> ~~as charged~~ as charged in the indictment, but guilty of unlawful assault, <sup>with the intent charged in the indictment,</sup> then you will say so and ascertain their punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for a period of not less than 1 year nor more than 5 years, or, in your discretion, by confinement in jail not exceeding 12 months and fined not exceeding \$500.

If you do not find them guilty of either of the felonies aforesaid, but guilty of <sup>simple</sup> assault and battery, then you will say so and ascertain their punishment by confinement in jail for a period not exceeding 12 months, or, by a fine not exceeding \$600, or both such fine and imprisonment.

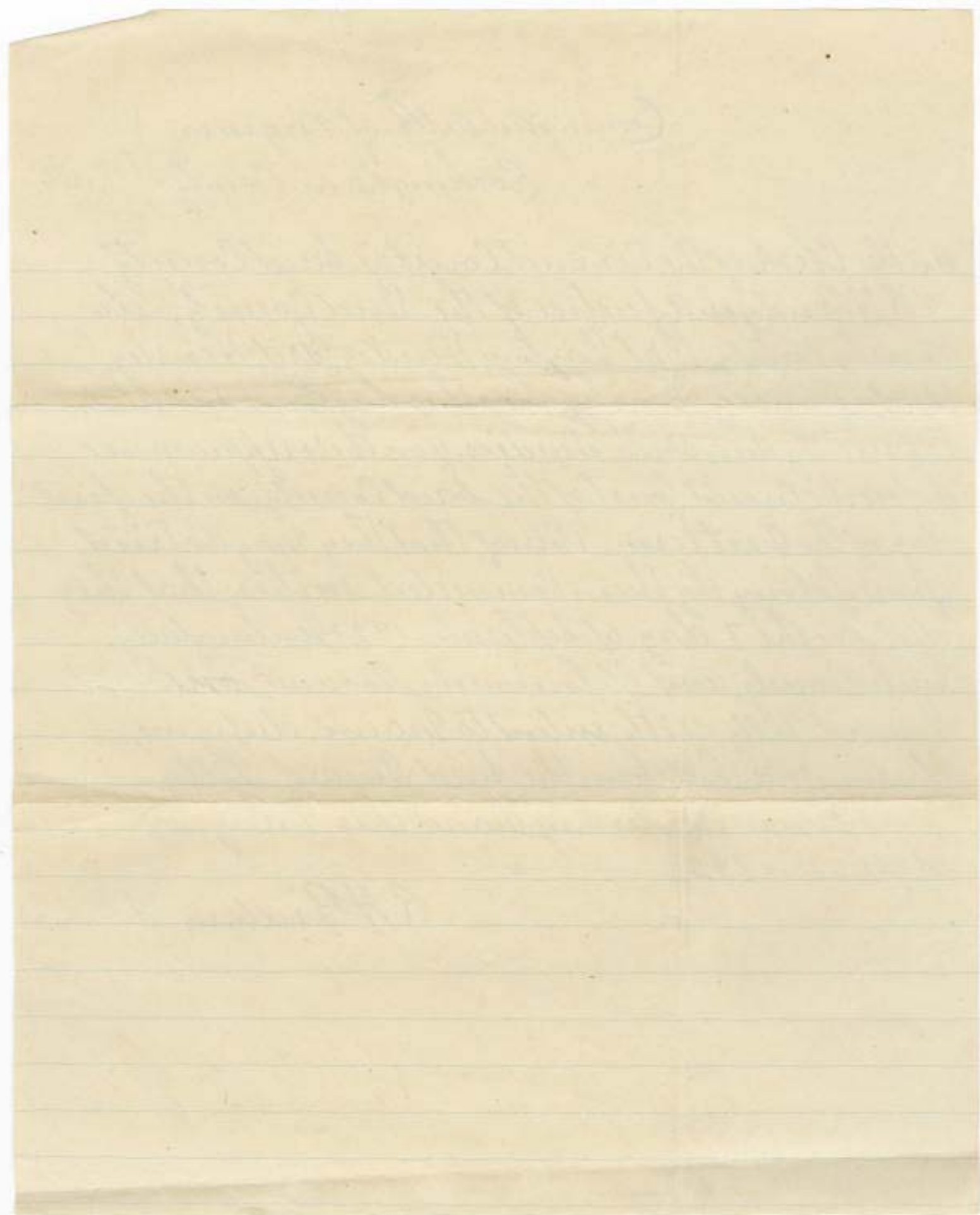
