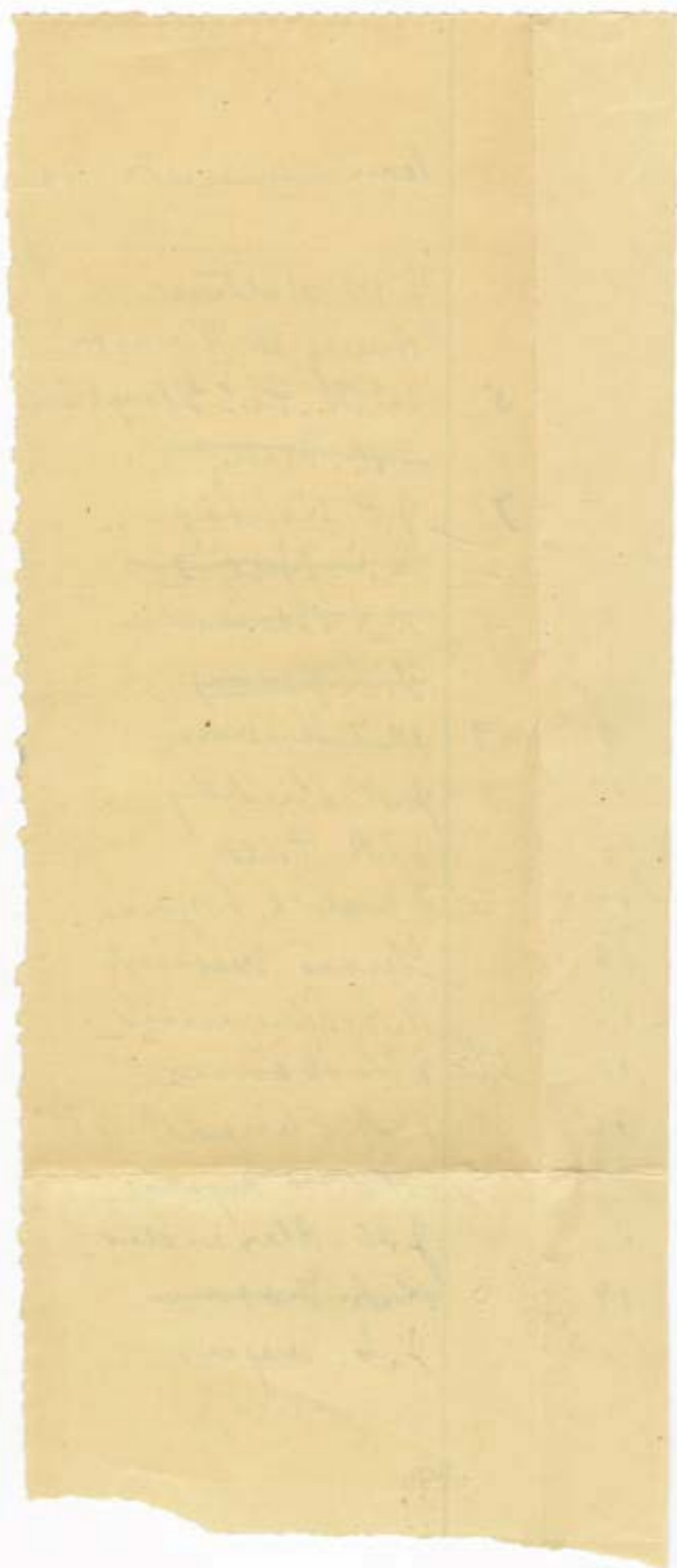

T. Heard, then and there being found, feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of J. T. Heard, J. O. Harnsberger, and Mrs. Nellie Watkins, witnesses sworn in court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.

Charge to the Jury

If ~~the jury~~ ^{you} find the accused not guilty, you will say so and no more.

If you find her guilty ^{of grand larceny} as charged in the indictment, you will say so and ascertain her punishment by confinement in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than ten years. If you do not find her guilty of grand larceny as charged in the indictment, but guilty of petit larceny, then you will say so and ascertain her punishment by confinement in jail for a period of not less than ten days nor more than twelve months, or by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or both.
