Charge to the Jury.

If you find the accused, Milton Grim, not guilty, you will say so and no more.

If you find him guilty of maliciously shooting Bernard Lam, with intent to maim, disfigure, disable or kill him, the said Bernard Lam, as charged in the indictment, you will say so and fix his punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for a period of from one to ten years.

If you do not find him guilty of maliciously shooting Bernard Lam with the intent aforesaid, but guilty of unlawfully shooting him with such intent, then you will say so and fix his punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for a period of not less than one nor more than five years, or, by confinement in jail for a period not exceeding twelve months and fine not exceeding five hundred dollars.

If you do not find him guilty of either of the felonies aforesaid, but guilty of assault and battery upon said Bernard Lam, then you will say so and fix his punishment by confinement in jail for a period not exceeding twelve months, or by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, or both such fine and imprisonment.

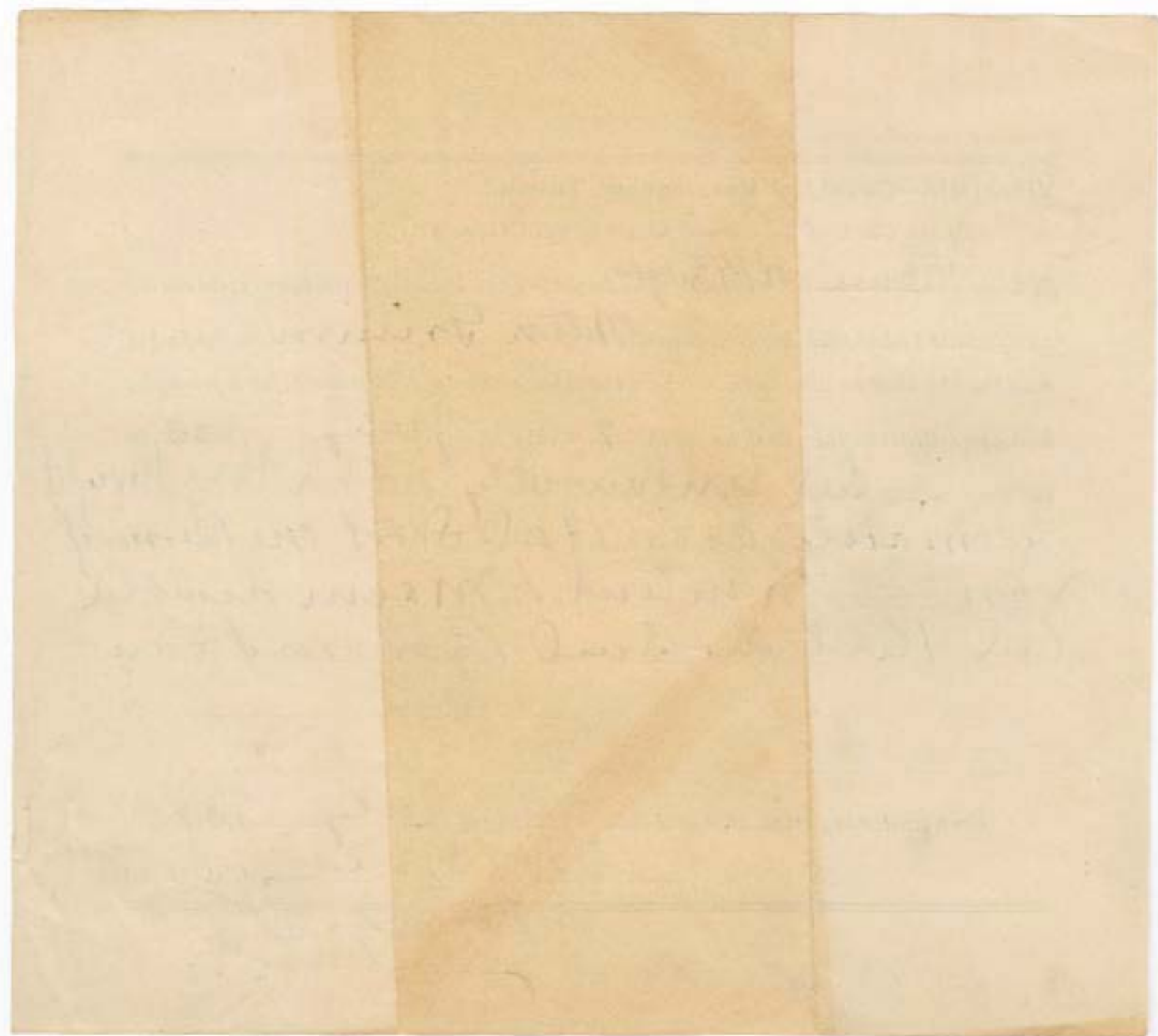

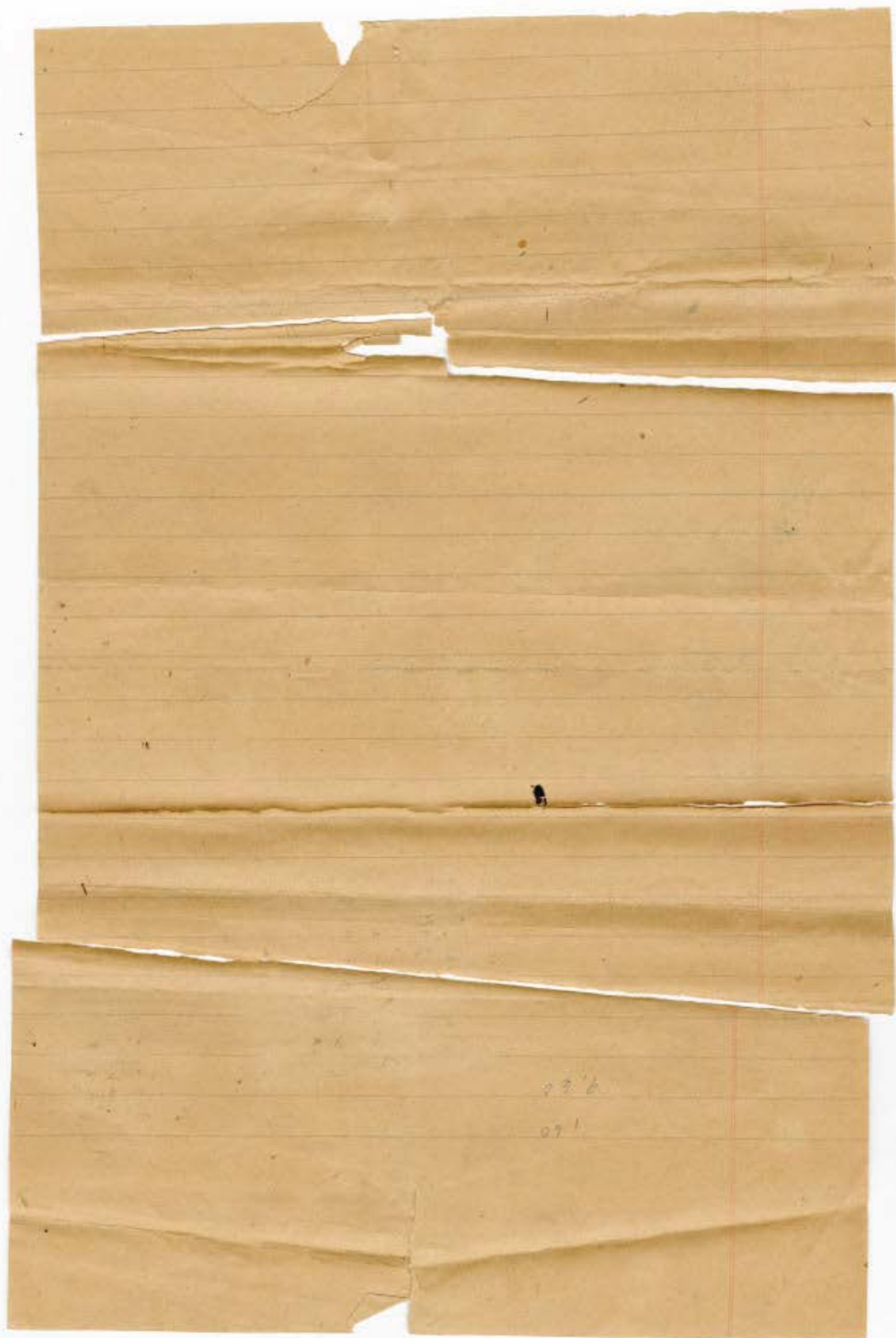

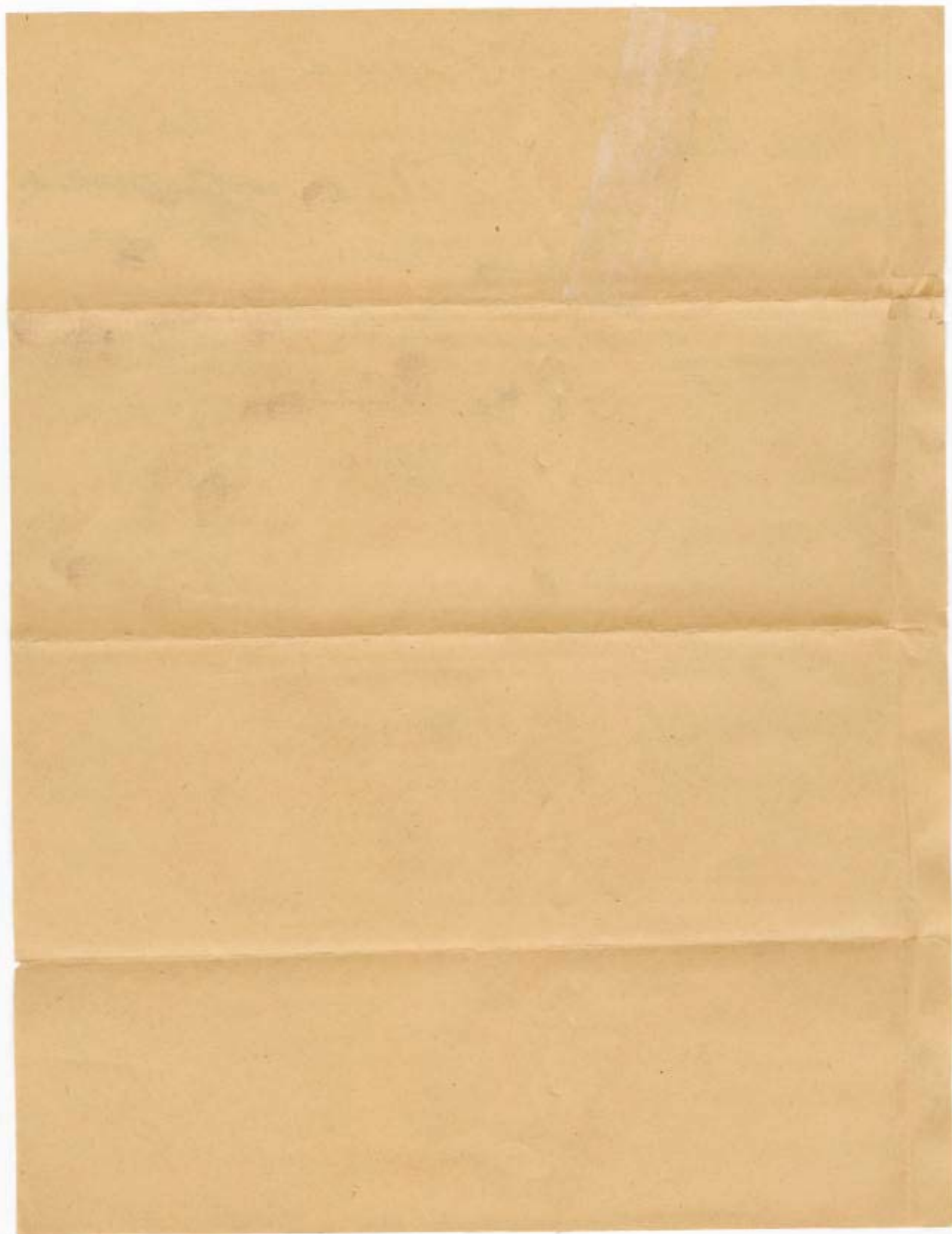
