INSTRUCTION ~~NO. 1~~

The Court instructs the jury that in this case, as in all criminal cases, the accused's plea of not guilty raises a presumption of innocence in his favor and puts on the Commonwealth the burden of proving his guilt beyond reasonable doubt. If, therefore, upon a consideration of the whole case, the testimony of the witnesses and the circumstances shown in evidence, there exists in the minds of the jury a reasonable doubt as to the guilt of the accused, they should find him not guilty. And the Court further tells the jury that a reasonable doubt is that state of the case which, after comparison and consideration of all the evidence, leaves the minds of the jurors in such condition that they cannot say that they feel an abiding conviction to a moral certainty of the truth of the charge.

INSTRUCTION NO. 1

The Court instructs the jury that in this case, as in all other cases, the accused's plea of not guilty raises a presumption of innocence in his favor and puts on the Government the burden of proving his guilt beyond reasonable doubt. It, therefore, upon a consideration of the whole case, the testimony of the witnesses and the circumstances shown in evidence, there exists in the mind of the jury a reasonable doubt as to the guilt of the accused. They should find him not guilty. And the Court further tells the jury that a reasonable doubt is that state of the case which, after comparison and consideration of all the evidence, leaves the mind of the jurors in such condition that they cannot say that they feel an abiding conviction to a moral certainty of the truth of the charge.

COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA,

COUNTY OF ROCKINGHAM, to-wit:

In the Circuit Court of said County:

The jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of said county and now attending said Court at its October term, 1924, upon their oaths do present that A. J. Crawford, Jr., on the 28th day of June, 1924, in the county aforesaid, in and upon one, Ralph Shifflett, feloniously, wilfully, and of his malice aforethought, did make an assault; and that the said A. J. Crawford, Jr., with a certain stone, in his hand then and there threw, the said Ralph Shifflett, in and upon the left side of the head, above the ear, the said Ralph Shifflett, then and there feloniously, wilfully, and of his malice aforethought did strike and thrust; giving to the said Ralph Shifflett, then and there, with the stone aforesaid, in and upon the aforesaid left side of the head, above the ear, a fractured skull to him, the said Ralph Shifflett, one mortal wound; of which said mortal wound, he, the said Ralph Shifflett, from the said 28th day of June, in the year aforesaid, to the 1st day of July, in the year aforesaid, in the county aforesaid, did languish and languishing did live; on which said 1st day of July, in the year 1924, the said Ralph Shifflett, in the county aforesaid, of said mortal wound, died; and so the jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do say, that the said A. J. Crawford, Jr., the said Ralph Shifflett, in manner and form aforesaid, feloniously, wilfully, and of his malice aforethought, did kill and murder, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of Jack Snow, Wm. Stanley, James Snow, Lester Lam, and L. H. Bruce, witnesses sworn in court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.
