ROY FRIDLEY :

If you find the accused, Roy Fridley, not guilty, you will say so and no more.

If you find him guilty as charged in the indictment, then you will say so and fix his punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for not less than one nor more than five years, or, in your discretion, by confinement in jail for a period not exceeding one year, or by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, or both such fine and imprisonment.

We the jury find the accused, Roy Fritley, guilty
of involuntary manslaughter, ^{as charged in the indictment,} and put his punishment at
three years in the penitentiary.

CHARGE TO THE JURY.

Charge to the jury.

It is found the accused, Roy Fritley, has
been charged with the crime of manslaughter,
and it is your duty to determine whether or not
he is guilty of the same. If you find him guilty,
you must determine what punishment he should
receive. The law provides that the punishment
for manslaughter is imprisonment for not less
than one year and not more than five years,
or in your discretion, by a fine not exceeding
one year, or by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars,
or both such fine and imprisonment.

Indictment against Roy Fridley for the murder of William Weaver
by striking him with an automobile as aforesaid

COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA.

COUNTY OF ROCKINGHAM, to-wit:

In the Circuit Court of said County:

The jurors of the Commonwealth in and for the body of the county of Rockingham and now attending said court at its October term, 1925, upon their oaths do present that Roy Fridley, on or about August 6, 1925, in the county aforesaid, ~~in and upon one William Weaver, feloniously did make an assault; and that the said Roy Fridley, while driving an automobile under the influence of intoxicants on the Elkton Turnpike, about seven miles east of Harrisonburg, in Rockingham County, Virginia, did strike ^{one} ~~the~~ said William Weaver with said automobile while the said William Weaver was riding a horse, then and there by such driving of said automobile under the influence of intoxicants, ^{by striking him with an automobile as aforesaid} injuring and wounding him, the said William Weaver, ^{crushing} and breaking his leg, and otherwise injuring the said William Weaver, thereby causing the said William Weaver to suffer a mortal wound, of which mortal wound he, the said William Weaver from the 6th day of August, in the year aforesaid, to the 7th day of August, in the year aforesaid, in the county aforesaid, did languish, and languishing, did live, on which said 7th day of August, 1925, the said William Weaver, in the county aforesaid, of the said mortal wound died, and so the jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do say that the said Roy Fridley, him, the said William Weaver, in the manner aforesaid, feloniously did kill, ~~and murder,~~ against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.~~

This indictment is found on the testimony of ^{Wm.} Wm. Davis, Melvin Deavers, C. W. Dove, W. D. Pirkey, Ripley Walker, ^{W. C.} W. C. Echard, and Frank Switzer, witnesses sworn in court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.

We the jury find the accused, Roy Fridley guilty of involuntary manslaughter, as charged in this indictment and fix his punishment at three years in the penitentiary -
