The jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia in and for the body of the county of Rockingham and now attending said Court at its October term, 1926, upon their oaths do present that Jacob P. Myers, on the 8th day of August, 1926, in the county aforesaid in and upon one Harry F. Bull feloniously did make an assault; and that the said Jacob P. Myers, with his fist, then and there, the said Harry F. Bull, in and upon the head of the said Harry F. Bull, feloniously did strike and thrust; giving to the said Harry F. Bull then and there, with his fist aforesaid, in and upon the head of the aforesaid Harry F. Bull, one mortal wound; of which said mortal wound, he, the said Harry F. Bull, from the said 8th day of August, in the year aforesaid, to the 9th day of August, in the year aforesaid, in the county aforesaid, did languish, and languishing did live; on which said 9th day of August, the said Harry F. Bull, in the county aforesaid, of the said mortal wound died; and so the jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do say that the said Jacob P. Myers the said Harry F. Bull in manner and form aforesaid, feloniously did kill, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of Clarence Rolinger, Ernest Reff, Dr. W. A. Vaughn, Frank Hilbert, Clyde Campbell, Paul Campbell, Chas. Comer, and Leonard Crist, witnesses sworn in court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.

of the said county of Rockingham, and severally and respectively acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in manner and form following, that is to say: the said

in the sum of One Thousand - - - - - Dollars of like good and lawful money, to be

respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, and they severally waived the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this obligation, and also waived any claim or right to discharge any liability to the Commonwealth arising under this recognizance with coupons detached from the bonds of this State, to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia if the said Jacob P. Myers- shall make default in the performance of the conditions underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Jacob P. Myers - - - - - do and shall personally appear before the Circuit Court of Rockingham on the first day of the October - - - - - Term next thereof, being the 18th day of October 1926, at the Court-house thereof, and then and there answer the Commonwealth of Virginia concerning a certain Felony - - - - - whereof the said Jacob P. Myers- - - - - stands charged, and shall not depart thence without the leave of said Court, then the above recognizance shall be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
