INSTRUCTION NO. _____.

The Court instructs the jury that the credibility of the witnesses is a question exclusively for the jury; and the law is that, where witnesses testify in conflict or contradiction of each other, the jury is not bound to regard the evidence as equally balanced, but it is the duty of the jurors to judge the evidence for themselves and to give such weight to the testimony of the different witnesses as under all the circumstances they think them entitled to.

The Court instructs the jury that the
evidence in the case is as follows: the witness
for the jury; and the law is that, where witness
testify in conflict or contradiction of each other,
the jury is not to regard the evidence as equally
believed, but it is the duty of the jury to judge the
evidence for themselves and to give such weight to the
testimony of the different witnesses as under all the
circumstances they deem proper to.

Charge to the Jury.

If you find the accused, Con Warble, not guilty, you will say so and no more.

If you find him guilty as charged in the indictment, then you will say so and fix his punishment at confinement in the penitentiary for not less than one nor more than five years, or, in your discretion, at confinement in jail for not less than six nor more than twelve months, and by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars.

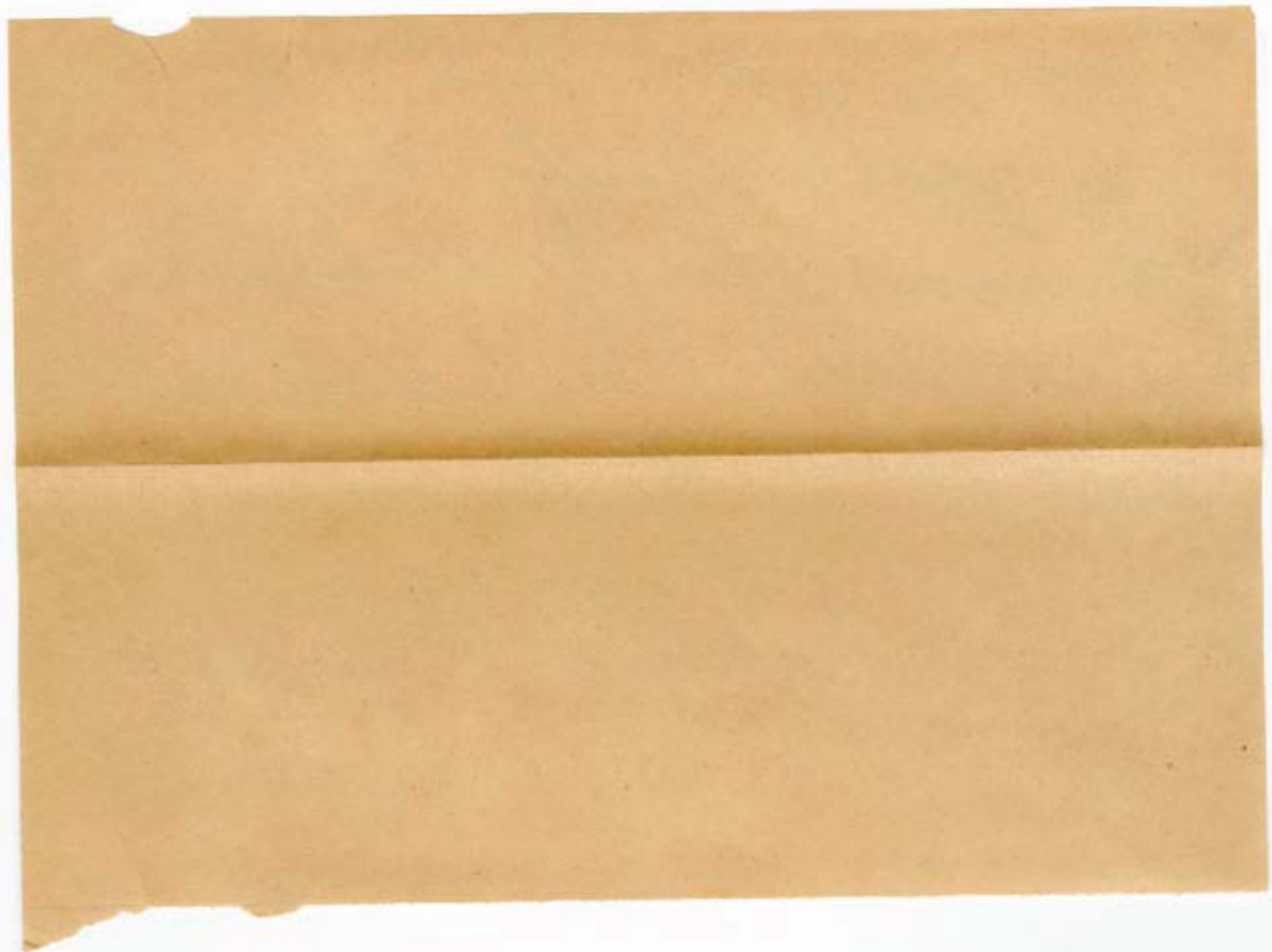
