In the Circuit Court of said County:

The jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of said county of Rockingham and now attending said Court at its October term, 1927, upon their oaths do present that Owen Shirkey on or about the 4th day of October, 1927, in said county, a certain out house, commonly called a blacksmith shop, the property of Ike Wean, there situate, feloniously did break and enter in the nighttime, with intent the goods and chattels of the said Ike Wean in said blacksmith shop then and there being, feloniously to steal, take, and carry away, and one pair of clippers, of the value of five dollars, of the goods and chattels of the said Ike Wean in the said blacksmith shop then and there being found, feloniously did steal, take, and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of R. C. Morrison and Ike Wean, witnesses sworn in Court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.
