In the Circuit Court of said County:

The grand jurors in and for the body of said county of Rockingham and now attending said Court at its April term, 1929, upon their oaths do present that Ira J. Dove, Elmer F. Dove, Emery E. Dove, O. D. Smith, and Loy Smith, in the said County of Rockingham on or about March 31, 1929, did unlawfully and wilfully disturb an assembly met for the worship of God at the Caplinger United Brethern Church, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

And the jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that Ira J. Dove, Elmer F. Dove, Emery E. Dove, O. D. Smith, and Loy Smith, on or about March 31, 1929, in the said County of Rockingham, while under the influence of ardent spirits, did unlawfully disturb an assembly met for the worship of God at the Caplinger United Brethern Church, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of C. B. Caplinger, Vena D. Caplinger, Seymour May, Harvey E. Dove, J. W. Lantz, Perry I. Dove, R. J. Dove, and L. E. Dove, witnesses sworn in Court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.
