If you find him guilty of murder, as charged in the indictment, and that the same was committed with malice aforethought and was wilful, deliberate and premeditated, then you shall find him guilty of murder in the first degree and ascertain his punishment at death, or, in your discretion, by confinement in the penitentiary for life, or for any term not less than twenty years.

If you find him guilty of murder, as charged in the indictment, and the same was committed with malice aforethought, but was not wilful, deliberate and premeditated, then you shall find him guilty of murder in the second degree, and ascertain his punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for not less than five nor more than twenty years.

If you find him not guilty of murder in the first degree or of murder in the second degree, but that he killed Robert Davis without malice aforethought, actual or implied, upon a sudden heat, on reasonable provocation, or in mutual combat, you will find him guilty of voluntary manshaughter, and ascertain his punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for not less than one nor more than five years.

If you find him not guilty of murder in the first degree or of murder in the second degree, or of voluntary manslaughter fut guilty of involuntary manuslanghter as charged in the you will say so and ascertain his punishment by confinement in the penitentiary for not less than one nor more than five years, or in your discretion, assess a fine against him of not exceeding \$1,000.00, or by confinement in jail for not exceeding one year, or both.
