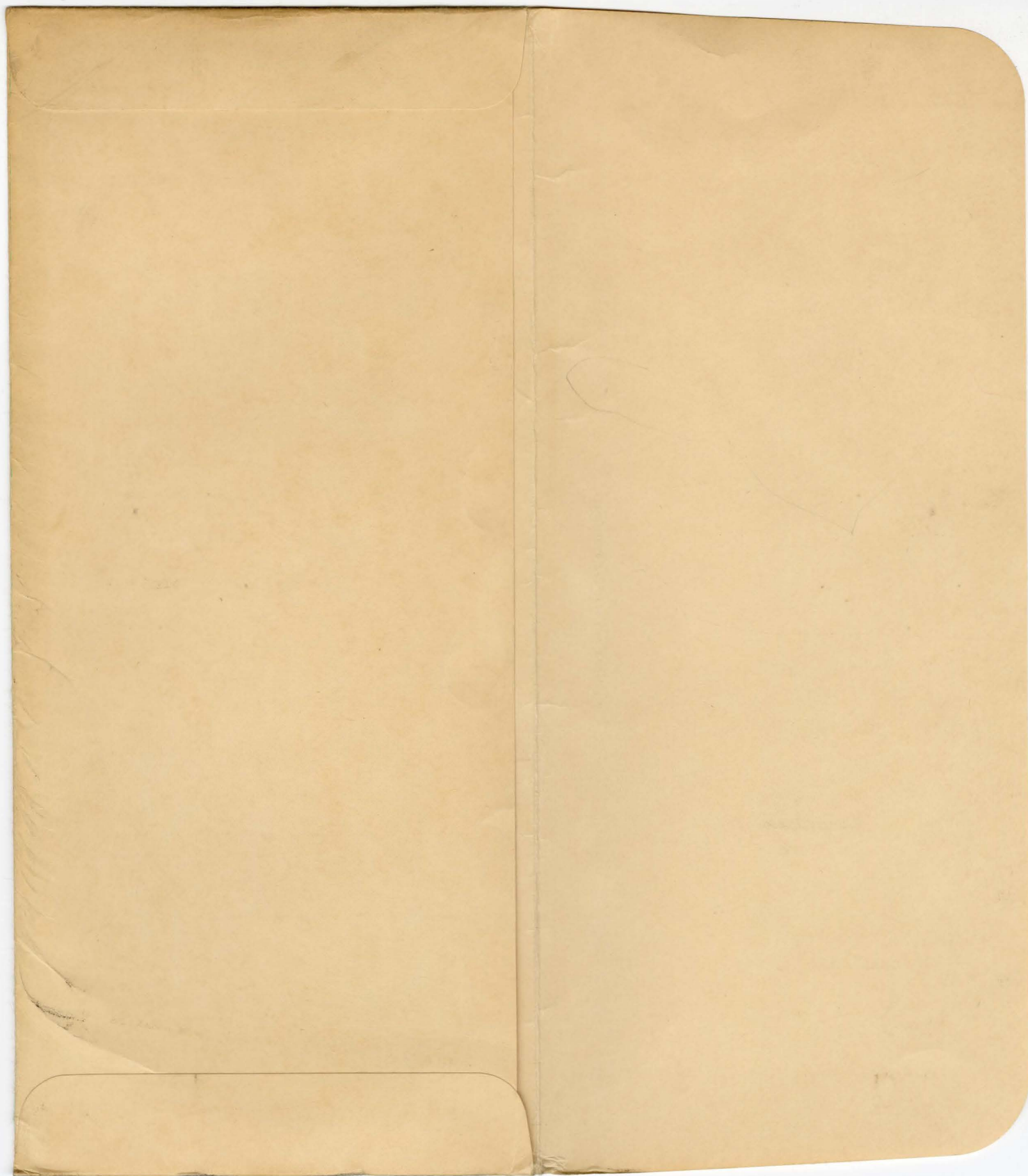

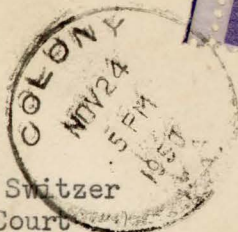

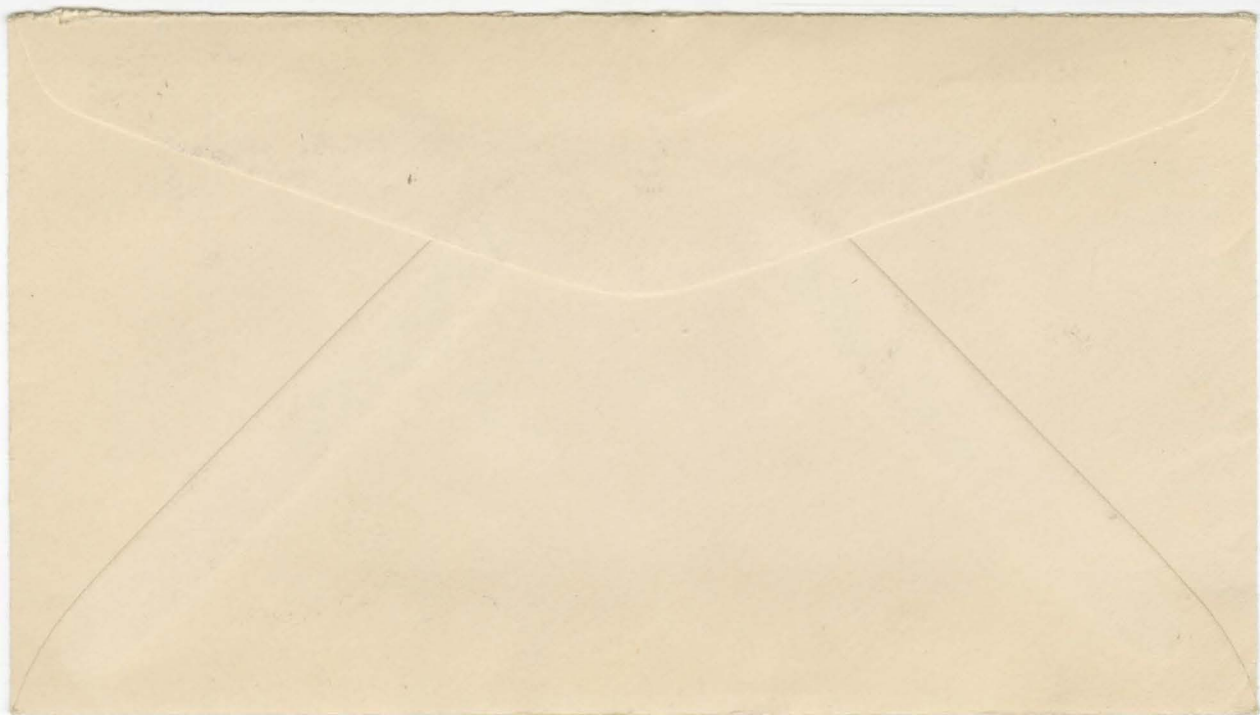

Examinations made here indicate that he is definitely feeble-minded and that his intelligence level is that of an imbecile. He is not considered, from the standpoint of his mental condition, as being a suitable candidate for trial.

Charles was paroled in care of his mother, Mrs. Melvin Tobin, Route 3, Harrisonburg, Virginia, on March 24, 1951. As far as I can tell he is still in the home of his mother.

There is a possibility that the operation of sexual sterilization will be recommended in Charles' case. This cannot be done as long as he is here on Court Order.
