My name is Olin Gilmer Kephart; I am 44 years of age; and I live on Route 2, Harrisonburg, Virginia, in a one-room house that I built five or six years ago on the James about two Miles from
Baugher farm Ast the foot of Shand's hill. I make this statement of my own free will and accord and I understand that everything I say can and will be used against me in a criminal prosecution. Nevertheless, I do make the following statement this 19th day of September 1954, in the office of the Commonwealth's Attorney, Courthouse, Harrisonburg, Virginia, in the presence of Commonwealth's Attorney George D. Conrad, Sheriff A. L. Strawderman, Deputy Sheriff Robert H. Raynes, and Court Reporter C. Overton Lee:

My wife, Dorothy Kephart, and I were living together in this one-room building at the time of the shooting. Our six children have been put in homes by the Welfare Department and I am paying the Welfare people. I work for the Freelin company who is building the addition to the Waterman School.

The trouble I had with my wife started on Saturday afternoon, September 18. I had been off from work all of that day. In the morning, we came to Harrisonburg where we drank a couple of beers and purchased two fifths of wine, which we took home. I ate a sandwich in town and my wife and I returned home about noon. I don't know exactly what

Overton Lee:

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The trouble I had with my wife started on Saturday afternoon, September 18. I had been off from work all of that day. In the morning, we came to Harrisonburg where we drank a couple of beers and purchased two fifths of wine, which we took home. I ate a sandwich in town and my wife and I returned home about noon. I don't know exactly what

time the trouble commenced, but it was some time after we arrived home where we had continued our drinking and had consumed one of the fifth bottles of wine and part of the second. We were both pretty drunk.

While we were in the house, my wife got to cussing and raising the devil and I told her to keep quiet. She grabbed up a hammer and struck me at the back of my head and on the shoulder, and then picked up a butcher knife and cut me down over the head, which brought the blood that was on me, but none of the blows required medical attention for me. The blow from the hammer knocked me down and I reckon knocked me crazy. I just don't remember exactly what happened after that. Some things I can remember and some I can't; it looks like things come and go.

After she had struck and cut me, she started to leave the house and I grabbed a single-barreled shotgun that was setting at the side of the bed, and which I had bought at Paul's Trading Post back in the summer, and also a handful of cartridges with No. 5 shot. When I shot at her, we were both outside. She was about 24 feet from me when I shot, and I was about halfway from the house to her when I shot.

I have not done much shooting and very little hunting.

The first time I shot at her, I missed, and she turned around and started back towards me. I reloaded the gun and fired at her again and missed the second time, and she

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The first time I shot at her, I missed, and she turned around and started back towards me. I reloaded the gun and fired at her again and missed the second time, and she

kept coming towards me. The third time, I reloaded and shot and hit her. She was still carrying the hammer and butcher knife at the time she fell. I shot her because she had knocked me down with the hammer and I didn't know whether she wanted to kill me or what she wanted to do.

When she fell to the ground, I left her laying there, I did not go up to where she was, and I went back in the house and locked the gun up in my tool box. I stayed in the house until the sheriff came after me and at that time I turned my shotgun over to him. In the meantime, my wife had gotten up and gone somewheres, but I don't know where.

I don't know if she left the house because I got the gun or not, but she was wanting to come back to Harrisonburg and I kept telling her that she had no business back in town. The fight was still going on when I grabbed the gun, but, as I remember, she did not say anything when I got it; and while I would not be too sure about it, I do not think she tried to take the gun away from me. She was drinking right smart.

My wife and I were married about 1934. She is several your ger years elder than me. We had been having trouble for a long time before this, mostly about her coming to town and running around, but it never got to be anything serious. I had told her a couple of times to leave, but she would go off and stay a night or two and then come back again.

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1 I have never been in any trouble before for cutting 2 or shooting anybody, or anything like that; the only trouble 3 I have had has been caused by drunkenness. We were to move from this house on the day of this 5 trouble, but I could not get a truck. 
