

In 1944, the father was convicted of Larceny in the Criminal Court of Baltimore and placed on probation for two years. The parents were frequently separated between 1939 and 1949. The mother was described as an individual of normal intelligence, tense and emotionally disturbed by reason of financial and domestic difficulties. Due to the disturbed home situation, the subject was allowed to go and come as he pleased. The family lived in an objectionable neighborhood and the subject was badly conditioned by delinquent associations. He was a serious truancy and behavior problem at an early age. It is important to note that the Juvenile Court and other agencies were unable to effect any improvement in the home or in the attitude of the parents. The disorganization in the home persisted. The subject was easily influenced by disruptive neighborhood elements, keeping late hours, and showing a tendency to restlessness and wanderlust--a pattern previously manifested by his father. In tests given in 1949 and 1950, he showed an intelligence level of 97. 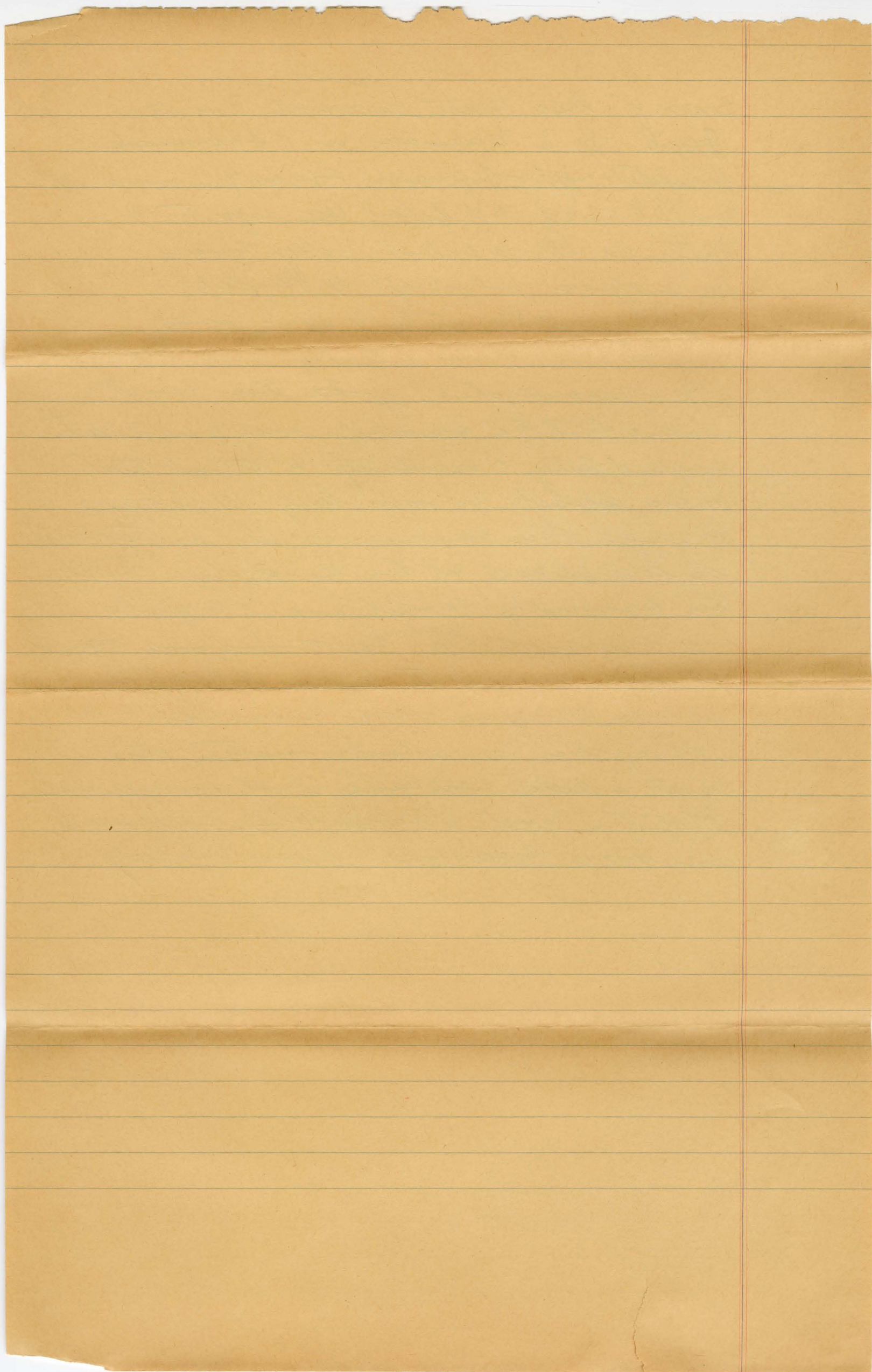

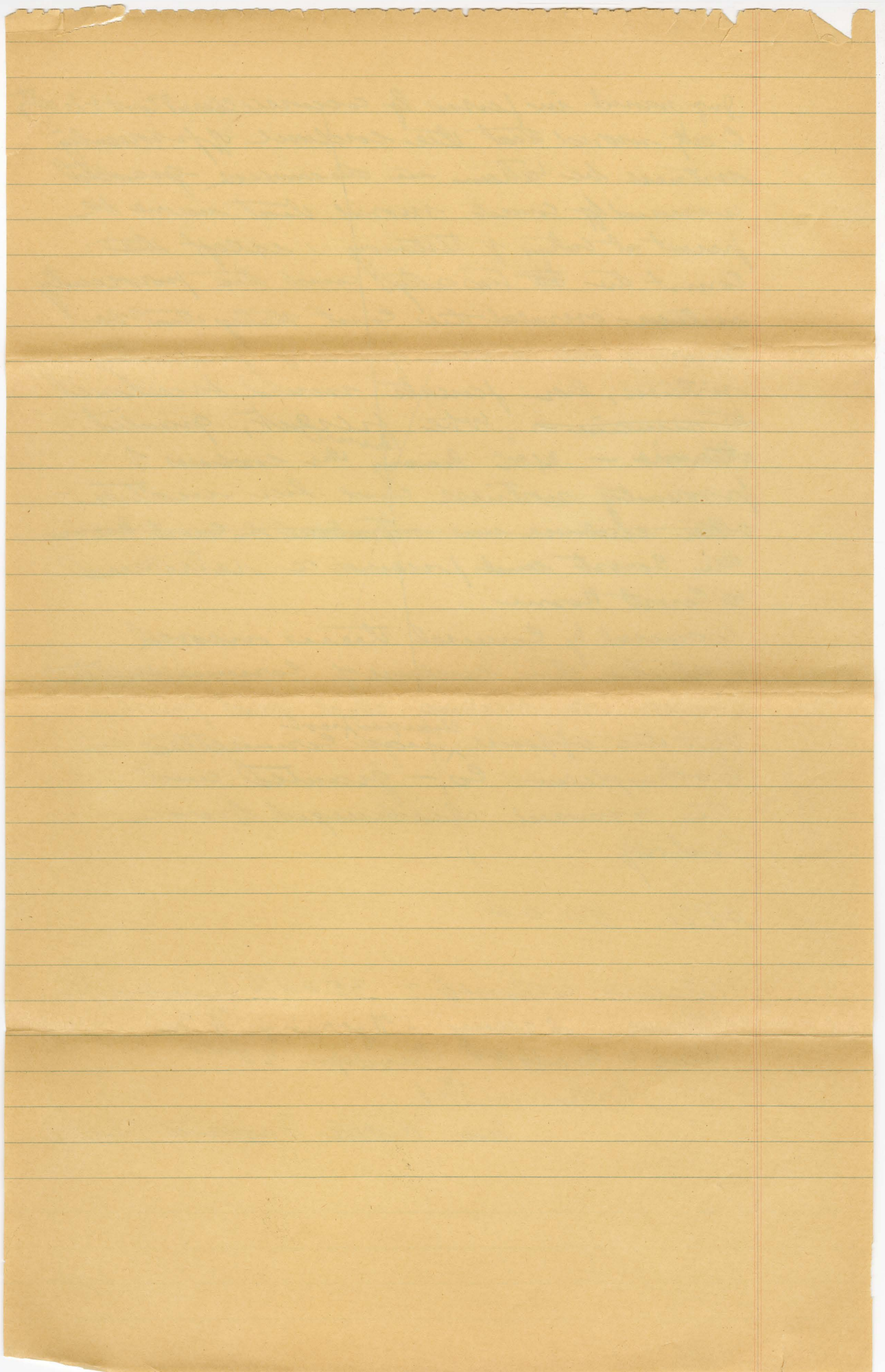

This day came the attorney for the Commonwealth, and the accused, George Walter Francis Tucker, came in the custody of the sheriff of this county and by his attorney heretofore appointed, namely, Sam P. Conrad. Thereupon, said accused, after consulting with his attorney, in person, and by counsel, and with the consent of the court and the attorney for the commonwealth, waived trial by jury and agreed to submit all matters of law and fact to the court for hearing and determination. Thereupon, John H. Ramsey, Probation Officer for this Parole District, filed with the court a report of Peter E. Coughlin, Acting Senior Parole Officer of the Department of Parole and Probation of the State of Maryland, of date January 15, 1957, and the said Ramsey was present in court and subject to cross-examination touching the matters contained in said report; ~~and the court~~ ~~considered~~ upon consideration whereof, the court ruled that the said accused was of sufficient understanding and mentality to stand trial as an adult, he now being eighteen (18) years of age. Whereupon, the attorney for the commonwealth introduced evidence on behalf of the commonwealth, and at the conclusion thereof the accused, by counsel, moved the court to strike such evidence because it had failed to prove that the offense charged was committed in Rockingham County, which motion the court sustained; and there being no evidence before the court ~~xxx~~ by reason of which the accused could be held, the said George Walter Francis Tucker was discharged from custody.

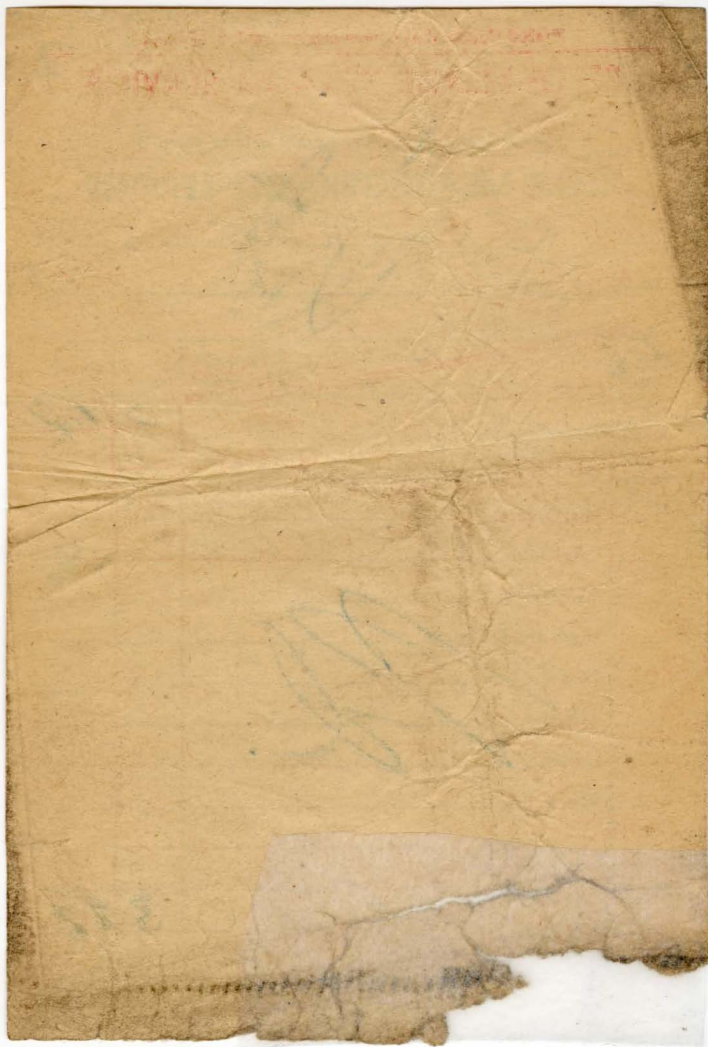
