COURT ACTION:

Roger Milton Lowe, Jr. appeared in the Rockingham County Circuit Court on October 21, 1963, with the Honorable Hamilton Haas presiding. The defendant was indicted on a charge of Robbery by Force and through the advice of his appointed attorney, Mr. Donald Litten, he entered a plea of guilty to the indictment. The Court found the defendant guilty as charged in the indictment but withheld imposition of sentence until a Pre-Sentence Report could be presented, which was requested by the defense counsel. The subject was remanded to the Rockingham County Jail to await the presentation of a Pre-Sentence Report. This man has been in custody since his arrest on September 23, 1963.

OFFENSE:

The subject is charged by an indictment that he did on September 23, 1963, while armed with a deadly weapon to-wit: a .22 caliber rifle loaded with ball ammunition, did enter the Rockingham National Bank of Harrisonburg, Grottoes Branch, with the intent to commit larceny of money therefrom in Violation of Section 18.1-90 of the 1950 Code of Virginia.

The victim of this offense was the Rockingham National Bank at Grottoes, Virginia, and the codefendants were Robert Harrington, Jr. and James Miklos. According to the subject, the offense occurred as follows: He stated that he and codefendant Miklos had planned to go to the State of New Jersey on Friday, September 20, in order to take James Miklos' wife to her home in New Jersey. The subject stated that on Friday, September 20, that he, codefendant Miklos, Mrs. Miklos, and a Robert Black traveled to New Jersey and they traveled in a car which was owned by Robert Black. The subject stated that on Friday he drank a couple of beers and when he went home his wife did not want him to go to New Jersey, as she knew he had been drinking. The subject advised that since he had promised Miklos previously that he would go to New Jersey, he decided to go even though his wife objected.

The subject stated he drove the car and that all three of the men drank beer and whiskey while traveling. The subject advised that they returned to Washington, D. C. on Saturday and he spent the night with other friends in Washington, and codefendant Miklos and Black stayed elsewhere. The subject reported that they returned to Harrisonburg on Sunday, September 22, and mentioned that they had been drinking beer and some whiskey intermittently all weekend. He stated that when they returned to Harrisonburg he did not go home, but let Mr. Black out at his house and he and codefendant Miklos kept the car, afterwhich they went to several restaurants in Harrisonburg and continued to drink, etc.

RE: Roger Milton Lowe, Jr.

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The subject stated that he and codefendant Miklos met codefendant Harrington around 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 22, reportedly at Susie's Lunch in Harrisonburg. While all three of them were drinking beer, codefendant Miklos reportedly mentioned robbing the bank.

The subject stated that they drove around most of the night, and early Monday morning they went to Armstrong's Restaurant and picked up a .22 rifle which he had taken there previously to have repaired. The subject stated that this gun had not been firing correctly and he had taken it to a man who lived over the Armstrong Restaurant to have this gun repaired, and he mentioned they picked up this gun Monday before the gun had been repaired.

The subject advised that they then proceeded to the Grottoes Area, and while in the Grottoes Area drank a couple more beers. He stated that they then went to the bank, but did not enter then as there were customers in the bank. He stated they drove around some and then had a flat tire which they had to fix. They then went back to the bank at approximately 10:50 a.m. The subject stated they parked the car at the Bank's entrance and that he and codefendant Harrington entered the bank and he talked with one of the Bank Teller's concerning an auto loan. A short while later, codefendant Miklos entered the bank with the .22 rifle.

According to the bank employees present at that time, money was taken from only one cash drawer and after the money was gotten, the three female bank employees were locked behind an iron gate in the bank vault as the door of the vault was not closed, and then the subject and the codefendants left the bank. According to the bank employees, \$6,210.00 was taken and all of this money was recovered except \$208.50, which was covered by insurance. They reported there were no customers present at the time of the robbery and that no one was injured or mistreated physically.

After the robbery, the subject and his codefendants left in the car and were apprehended by law enforcement authorities approximately one-half hour later in the Montevideo Area. The subject and his codefendants reportedly did not resist arrest. However, they were approximately three-fourths of a mile from their car when they were apprehended.

The subject stated he could give no definite reason for being involved in such an offense, but mentioned that he had been drinking fairly regularly all weekend and mentioned he wanted to "back out", but did not, in order to "save face".

According to information received from the law enforcement authorities, the weapon was a .22 caliber rifle which was loaded, but was not fired during the offense.

PRIOR RECORD:

The subject appeared in the Rockingham County Court on August 3, 1961, charged with illegal registration and he paid fine and costs of \$13.75. The subject stated this was on a company vehicle he was driving. The subject re-appeared in the Rockingham County Court on February 5, 1963, charged with illegal registration and paid fine and costs of \$30.75. The subject was charged with unlawful entry in New York City on July 4, 1958, and this charge was dismissed. He also appeared in the Fairfax Juvenile Court, Fairfax, Virginia, on October 26, 1955, charged with assault, and he was released with a warning.

RE: Roger Milton Lowe, Jr.

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FAMILY HISTORY:

Roger Milton Lowe, Jr., white married male, age 25, was born February 1, 1938. He is the second of five children born to the marriage of Roger Milton Lowe, Sr. and Carrie Louise Mosher Lowe. The subject's father stated that he and his wife were married in 1929 at Arlington, Virginia.

The subject's father, Roger Milton Lowe, Sr., age 48, stated he was born on May 5, 1915, at Leesburg, Virginia. The subject's father stated he completed high school and attended one year at Shepherdstown College, Shepherdstown, West Virginia. He presently resides at the Valley Trailer Park, Route #3, Harrisonburg. He reported he enjoys good health and is employed as a well driller for Mr. George F. Burner, McGaheysville, Virginia. This man reported he is a member of the Methodist Church, however, attends the Greenmount Church of the Brethren at the present time. The subject's father has been in Court for traffic violations and being drunk and disorderly, but reported no felony record. The subject's father is living with a Mrs. Effie Dean and it was reported that this couple has lived together for 17 years.

The subject's mother, Carrie Louise Mosher Lowe, is reported to have been born in Arlington. Very little information was received regarding this woman; however, reports indicate that she was very unstable, drank excessively, and did not provide a suitable home for her children. Reports indicate that the Fairfax Welfare Department made numerous attempts to rehabilitate the subject's mother, but was unsuccessful. According to the subject, his mother died on August 23, 1959, of double pneumonia.

The subject has the following siblings:

Mary Louise Lowe - this child died of pneumonia when approximately one year old.

Edgar Hilbert Lowe - this child was placed out for adoption and the subject nor his father know his whereabouts.

Laura Margaret Lowe - this child was placed out for adoption and her whereabouts is unknown.

Carolyn Sue Lowe - this child died of pneumonia while an infant.

PERSONAL HISTORY:

The subject is the victim of a broken home. His father reported that he was in the service when the subject was born and further advised that he and the subject's mother separated from each other when the subject was quite young. According to reports received from the Fairfax County Welfare Department, the subject as well as his younger brother and sister were received into foster care in November of 1947 under an entrustment agreement filed by their mother, and official custody was received in 1948. It was reported that the subject lived in many foster homes, but did not adjust satisfactorily, primarily due to the attachment he had for his mother. It was reported that the welfare department attempted to work with Mrs. Lowe so she could better provide for her family, but this was unsuccessful and she was; therefore, unable to ever provide a suitable home for the children. As mentioned previously, the subject's two younger siblings were placed for adoption and he does not know their whereabouts. It was also reported that the subject was placed in the Blue Ridge Mountain School when he was approximately 12 years of age, but he did not stay in this school very long, and once again returned to the Arlington or Fairfax County Area. Reports indicate that the subject's custody was released from the Fairfax County Welfare Department in July of 1956.

RE: Roger Milton Lowe, Jr.

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The subject married Joann Walton Lowe on June 23, 1957. This woman is a native of Rockingham County. However, the marriage was reportedly not congenial, and it ended in a divorce December 28, 1962.

The subject then married Wanda May Smith Lowe on January 10, 1963. The subject's wife stated she was born on July 6, 1942, at Elkton, Virginia. She completed the tenth grade at Turner Ashby High School and is presently employed at the H. D. Lee Company at Broadway. The subject's wife has one child by a previous marriage who is Terry Lynn Milsted. This child was born January 7, 1961, and resides with her mother. Since the offense, the subject's wife has been living with her parents at the Valley Trailer Park, Route #3, Harrisonburg.

It should also be noted that the subject reported he was separated from his father when his parents separated and that he did not know his father's whereabouts until a short while after his mother died in 1959, and he indicated that he had not seen his father for approximately 17 years.

HOME AND NEIGHBORHOOD:

At the time of the offense, the subject was living with his wife and step-child at the Valley Trailer Park, Route #3, Harrisonburg, Virginia. The subject was renting a two-bedroom house trailer and paying \$68.00 per month. As the report would indicate, the subject has also lived periodically in Arlington and the Washington, D.C. Area, and also in New York.

EDUCATION:

It was reported that the subject completed the seventh grade in the Fairfax County Area. It was further reported that he dropped out of school while in the eighth grade shortly after his sixteenth birthday and was trying to establish a home with his mother during that time.

INTERESTS AND ACTIVITIES:

The subject stated he enjoyed hunting, fishing, and also enjoyed listening to records, playing a guitar, and sports.

RELIGION:

The subject reported he is a member of the Methodist Church, however, has not attended church in the past three years.

HEALTH:

The subject is approximately 6' 2" tall, weighs 175 pounds, has fair complexion, blue eyes, and light brown hair. The subject has a noticeable scar on the back of his right wrist and also a number of tattoos on both of his arms. The subject stated that he has had three hernia operations, and he reported he had a heart murmur. The subject stated he has the habit of smoking, did drink occasionally, but denied the use of narcotics.

During interviews, the subject appeared to be co-operative and truthful. He indicated remorse and it is felt that he now realizes the seriousness of this offense.

The subject married Joan Wilson Love on June 25, 1957. This woman is a native of Rockingham County, however, the marriage was reportedly not congenial, and it ended in a divorce December 22, 1962.

The subject was married to Kay Smith Love on January 10, 1963. The subject's wife stated she was born on July 6, 1942, at Edinburg, Virginia. She completed the tenth grade at Turner High School and is presently employed at the U. S. Lee Company at Knoxville. The subject's wife has one child by a previous marriage who is Jerry Lynn Whitehead. This child was born January 7, 1961, and resides with her mother. Since the offense, the subject's wife has been living with her parents at the Valley Trailer Park, Route 27, Harrisonburg.

When the subject was arrested on June 2, 1968, he was living at the address listed in the report. He has not been seen since that time. He was last seen in 1967, and he indicated that he had not seen the father for approximately 17 years.

WORK AND RECREATION:

At the time of the offense, the subject was living with his wife and step-child at the Valley Trailer Park, Route 27, Harrisonburg, Virginia. The subject was working a two-bedroom house trailer and paying \$6.00 per week. He reported working full-time, and the subject had also lived periodically in Harrisonburg and the Washington, D.C. area, but also in New York.

EDUCATION:

It was noted that the subject completed the seventh grade in the Edinburg County area. It was further reported that he dropped out of school while in the eighth grade shortly after the sixteenth birthday and was trying to establish a home with his mother during that time.

INTERESTS AND ACTIVITIES:

The subject stated he enjoyed fishing, fishing, and also enjoyed listening to records, playing a guitar, and sports.

REMARKS:

The subject reported he is a member of the National Guard, however, has not served since in the past three years.

PHYSICAL:

The subject is approximately 6' 2" tall, weighs 175 pounds, and has wavy, light brown hair. The subject has a noticeable scar on the back of his right hand and also a number of tattoos on both of his arms. The subject reported he has had three hernia operations, and he reported he had a heart attack. The subject stated he has the habit of smoking, but drinks occasionally, but denied the use of narcotics.

With instructions, the subject appeared to be co-operative and truthful. He stated that he had no other relatives and that he had no other contacts.

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The subject could give no positive motive for committing this crime other than the fact that he had been drinking and did not have enough sense to "back out".

The subject has had no military experience and stated he was rejected from military service because of his having a heart murmur.

EMPLOYMENT: Social Security No. 226 46 7990

The subject's main work experience has been that of a laborer, working mainly on construction jobs and also worked in New York at different firms as a shipping clerk. The subject stated that he has been employed in the Harrisonburg Area at the Berman Bag Company and the Pioneer Construction Company. He has also been employed at the Nielsen Construction Company on several occasions and was working there at the time of the present offense. The subject was employed at the Nielsen Construction Company from August 1, 1963, through September 19, 1963. According to one of the foremen at the Nielsen Construction Company, the subject was a satisfactory employee. This man advised that the subject was a very good worker, also dependable, did what he was asked to do, and did not cause any trouble while on the job. He did mention that the subject was off from work occasionally. It should be noted that the subject became acquainted with his codefendants while working for the Nielsen Construction Company.

The subject indicated no resources or sizeable debts.

PLAN:

Several people were contacted while making this investigation. However, they did not express many feelings concerning the subject, as the subject is not too well known in this area.

If and when the subject is released from custody, it is probable that he can return to live with his wife as she has indicated a definite desire to live with him upon his release, and it is also felt that the subject's father would be willing to provide a home and employment would have to be secured.

It was stated that the subject is released from custody. It is probable that he can return to his home as she has indicated a definite desire to live with him upon his release, and it is also felt that the subject's father would be willing to provide a home and employment would have to be secured.


