

Know all men by these presents, that we John Brown & Michael Effinger are held and firmly bound unto the President and Directors of the Literary Fund and their successors in office, in the just & full sum of \$ 3434.20 cents, say: Three Thousand, four Hundred and Thirty and four Dollars, and twenty cent; to which payment well and truly to be made, to the said President and Directors of the Literary Fund, and their successors in office, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our Seals, and dated this 15<sup>th</sup> day of January 1836.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the above bound John Brown, was, on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of October 1835, by the School Commissioners in and for the County of Rockingham appointed their Treasurer for the year ending on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 1836 - Now if the said John Brown, shall faithfully apply & account for all monies which may come to his hands by virtue of his office, and shall do, perform and execute all & every act and thing appertaining to his said office, according to Law, then the above obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
