Upon consideration whereof, it appearing to the Court, that the claim of said Commission is not based upon any lien either on the land condemned, or on the proceeds of condemnation, and that said Commission has failed to obtain the consent of the parties entitled to the proceeds of condemnation, to have payment of its claim, it is accordingly adjudged and ordered that the motion of the Commission for the payment of said claim out of the proceeds of condemnation for said tract be and the same is Entro13 6/20/35 hereby denied.

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
